

Turn right on Centennial Drive and proceed 0.2 miles.

Turn right on Central Drive. Park in back of church and enter back entrance of the church.

I would like to remind you that attending a mission study is one of the requirements to be a Mission Today unit. This study must be at least four hours and approved by UMW. Our district mission study will be hosted by the UMW at Cullowhee UMC and begins at 9am for registration and goes until 2pm. Remember to bring your lunch or we will have to look for a small boy with loaves and fishes. Bring friends and relatives (male and female) and young people in your churches. This event is free as all district events are free and anyone is welcome. There are scholarships available for first-timers who wish to attend Mission u or Annual Celebration. Let me know if you need information about these.

NEW this year, the only UMCOR kits we will be preparing are health, school, and cleaning buckets. These will be distributed only in the US so there is no need to remove US insignia. Donations will be sent overseas providing support for local economies.

For 2018 the conference has stopped the LUV program that encouraged units to invite an officer to visit and have their name included in a drawing. Smoky Mountain District **WILL** continue with our nurturing partner (shepherdess) visits just as we have been doing.

I want to take this opportunity to thank all the units for your support last year. Being hostesses for conference events takes an effort by everyone. Thanks for stepping up. Also, to the units who hosted district events appreciation is due. I know that you all are active in your support of mission work in your communities as well as supporting UMW programs around the world. Thanks also for getting your year-end reports to me promptly.

The UMW National Office began the Legacy Fund in 2014 with a five-year commitment to create an endowment where the interest on this fund would continue to support the important mission works of our organization for future generations. On March 23, 2019 United Methodist Women will celebrate their 150<sup>th</sup> birthday. We want EVERY member to be a part of this once-in-alifetime happening!

Our Smoky Mountain District has been charged with raising \$63,314.57 toward the international goal of 60 million. To do that we are asking each member to contribute a minimum of \$18.69 for each of 5 years – in addition to her pledge – celebrating our founding in 1869 and each unit is asked to contribute \$186.90 for each of 5 years. You will receive a 150-year pin to add to your collection and can also purchase a special pin and/or a necklace that will go toward your contribution to the fund.

Your unit treasurer should have information about how to make your contributions.

I will be happy to come to your local meetings and present a program about this important commitment. We can't, and don't want to, imagine a future of women, children, and youth in the world without the mission work done by the United Methodist Women.

If you would like to volunteer for this position, please contact Debbie Ray, President, or myself. I will help you in any way possible, training, etc.

I received the following information about UMCOR Kits. As of January 1, 2018, UMCOR will be collecting only Health/Hygiene Kits, School Kits, and Cleaning Buckets for distribution within the United States. Relief grants will be offered to international partners to allow for local purchase and assembly of the kits which are more culturally appropriate.

Hands on Projects will be Health/Hygiene & School Kits. Ask your congregation to help participate in making kits for all four of our District meetings. At the present time our Mission Response Center in Terrell, NC does not need Cleaning Buckets. Dwaine Morgan, Mission Response Center Manager, needs help with processing all the kits that are awaiting shipment, so if your local unit or church can go and volunteer, give Dwaine a call at 828-478-2106 to arrange a time.

I have been asked "What is UMCOR doing for the survivors in Puerto Rico recovering from Hurricane Maria." I received from UMCOR on January 18th the following information: Distributed 6,732 Cleaning Buckets, 11,760 School Kits, 32,256 Health/Hygiene Kits, and 48,960 bottles of water. UMCOR has also sent grants, generators and other supplies.

In this month's WOMEN TALK I have included a Collection Sheet for UMCOR Kits (bring this to the District events). Cost of Shipping: Health/Hygiene = \$2.00 which includes buying toothpaste; and School Kits = \$1.00. Bring money or checks payable to UMCOR SAGER BROWN (please do not put money or checks inside of the Kits).

Will your UMW Unit be a Mission Today Unit for 2018? Promoting our mission work through prayer, study and action, and also many other things that support women, children and youth.

Many of our Units may be small in the number of members, but we are BIG in heart and working for UMW.

Please let me know if I can be of assistance to you.
