A NOTE ABOUT EDUCATION & INTERPRETATION:

As of May, 2018 UMCOR Kits have been revised. At the present time, we do not need Cleaning Buckets. Hygiene Kits now have 10 Adhesive Bandages, instead of six. Also, no metal files; clippers can be nail or toe. Two dollars (\$2) for toothpaste and shipping for each Hygiene Kit.

School Kits have also been revised to include the following: (A) Three (3) One Subject Notebooks (no composition or 3-5 subject notebooks). (B) One (1) Pack of 100-200 Loose Leaf Paper. (C) Homemade or purchased cloth Tote Bags are no longer acceptable. (D) Pack school items in a two gallon resealable Plastic Bag. (E) One dollar (\$1) shipping for each School Kit. PLEASE NOTE: If you do have the cloth schoolbags, we will send them to Project Agape in Armenia and they will be extremely happy to receive them.



FROM YOUR LEGACY TEAM ENERGIZER:

Why did you join United Methodist Women? I hope it was not **just** because your mother or grandmother was a member or to be part of a socially acceptable group. Although these are good reasons, our true purpose is to be in service and advocacy. We want to right the wrongs of injustice, to meet the urgent and critical needs of women, children and youth around the world. We must educate ourselves about these injustices and needs and then work to provide opportunities to meet these needs or to overcome the injustices.

We do this through the many institutions we continue to support as UMW.

As all are aware, we are an aging and shrinking group, here in the United States, at least. How can we maintain these institutions? Unfortunately, it takes money...something we don't like to talk about. (Please read our 2018 Mission u study book, <u>What About Our Money? A Faith Response</u>.) One way we can provide some security that our work continues for future generations is by supporting the Legacy Fund. Surely it is not too much of a hard-ship to ask each member to contribute a minimum of \$18.69 a year for 5 years. That's less that 6 cents a day. If every UMW member did this we would more than exceed our goal of \$6 million. There are multiple ways you can

contribute: through your local unit treasurer; send it directly to the Legacy Fund in New York; phone; text; on-line. Pick up a brochure at any District or Conference event that will give you specific information. Please support the Legacy Fund and educate and encourage all members of your local unit to understand the reason and need to support this effort to make sure our legacy of service and advocacy for women, children and youth continues far into the future.

Event lodging reservation deposit is equal to the first night's lodging and is due at the time of reservation. Any rooms not reserved with a Lodging Reservations Deposit will be released into general availability 30 days prior to an event. Individual lodging reservations deposit refund policy: 15 days or more before an event receive a full refund minus \$15 processing fee; 14 days or less before an event will not receive a refund.

EXPRESS CHECK-IN: To expedite check-in time, pay room in full at time of reservation or when contacted via email in advance of meeting and make any roommate changes.

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

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
