SOCIAL JUSTICE: SCHOOL TO PRISON PIPELINE

One of our UMW Focuses this year is the growing trend of a school-to-prison pipeline for our minority students and students of color. This term refers to our schools' practices of unequal and biased discipline and suspension procedures for minority kids which push these kids out of school and often towards juvenile and criminal justice systems. Many factors contribute to this trend: stereotypes of children of color, zero tolerance policies, excessive suspensions of minority kids while letting the same behavior in white kids pass, school funding cuts, poor educational opportunities in alternative or juvenile schools, and lack of counselors.

Our National Educational Association has realized this problem and has made a formal commitment to close this pipeline and is researching new strategies like restorative practices and other ways to keep kids in school. You can get a "Racial Equality Report Card" for your N.C. school system by going to the website youthjusticenc.org/our-work/racial-equality-report-cards.

AGE: Mission u Youth Camp is open to high school students who are rising 9th graders through those who have just completed 12th grade.

HOUSING: Housing will be in a college dorm.

CONSENT FORMS: For youth participants, there are covenant and consent forms that must be completed and accompany the basic registration form. Those forms are available from the school officers, district presidents, and our conference website at www.wncoumw.org. **There will be a youth curfew in effect at 11:30 PM.**

WHAT TO BRING:

- **Your Bible (of course!)**
- Musical instrument if you play
- Toiletries (soap, shampoo, body wash, etc. etc. etc.!!) Whatever you need to be clean & happy!
- Outdoor toiletries (bug spray & sun screen) Whatever you need to be comfortable!
- Sheets/blanket/pillow (Twin XL) or a sleeping bag instead of sheets/blanket
- Bath towels/wash cloths/hand towels
- Rain gear if forecasted
- Clothes, sleepwear, & footwear (**SOCKS & SHOES**) that will keep you comfortable & happy!

On Friday and Saturday, we will be going out into the community for hands-on ministry experiences and activities. You will need to wear a T-shirt or tank top (no spaghetti straps), shorts are fine (not too short), socks and closed-toed shoes. (You MUST have closed-toed shoes).

- Medicines (Please bring them in prescription bottles/containers)-Need parent/legal guardian's permission/advisement regarding your medicine schedule
- Copy of your health insurance card & vaccination records
- List of any dietary restrictions/concerns
- Jacket, sweat shirt, hat, sun glasses
- Small amount of spending money if desired
- Camp Chair
- It's OK to bring electronic devices (computers, e-readers, tablets, cell phones, etc. etc. etc.) **BUT you are responsible for them.** (Wireless internet is available on the campus.)
- **DO NOT BRING: Expensive items or items of sentimental value that you would be unhappy if they were lost or broken!**
- Also plan to bring Open Minds, Open Hearts, & Open Hands!

Notes from the Treasurer

As we begin our 2nd quarter of 2019, we can celebrate that the Uwharrie District has already given \$12,752.10 in Undesignated Mission Giving in Q1 towards our pledge of \$51,500 for this year. Our total Q1 Mission giving to the Western North Carolina Conference (WNCC) was \$14,445.66 and Legacy Fund money sent to National Office was \$428.21. This is a great start towards funding mission work for women, children and youth this year.

As a reminder, our 2019 WNCC UMW Financial Goal is to Increase Giving in the Gift to Mission Channel by \$3000. If each unit purchased just one additional Gift to Mission card, that goal would be far exceeded. What is a Gift to Mission card? It is essentially a greeting card, like a Hallmark card. Hallmark's slogan is "when you care enough to give the very best"; well with UMW Gift to Mission cards, it's more like "when you care enough to do the very best"! This is because with each card, the sender is thinking about Mission, the receiver gets a message about Mission, and a monetary contribution is made to support Mission.

The cost is \$5 per card, about the same as a Hallmark card, only all \$5 goes to Mission. We have cards for New Baby, Birthday, Congratulations, On Your Special Day, Thinking of You, Thank You, In the Service of Christ, Peace, and Christmas. You can order these cards through your local Treasurer, or you can buy them at District or Conference Events. If you buy them at events, it also saves on postage, plus you can see all the styles. Please consider buying/giving one or more Gift to Mission cards this year.

Treasurers, second quarter remittances are due to me by May 31st. Treasurers will be receiving a letter from me at the beginning of May regarding what to include in this remittance. If you need anything or have any questions, please feel free to call, text, or email me.

I look forward to seeing all of you at district and conference events.
