### Women of Smoky Mountain District UMW:

We have had a good response with our giving so far this year. We are over 40% toward our 2019 goal of \$41,000 in undesignated giving. We have 21 of our 32 churches who have set a pledge as a goal to reach for their personal pledge giving. There is still time to set a pledge and send it to me. We have already given \$1765 for "Call to prayer and self-denial". We have already designated \$1175 to the "Legacy Fund". In addition, we have collected \$956 for Chicken Feed which is also going to the Legacy Fund. All these numbers are something to celebrate. One person cannot do what we can do as a group.

I was reading in the "**Response**" magazine about a center for children in Alpine, Texas that is funded by UMW. That is just another one of the preschool and after school care centers that we support. I have read about several of them including the Bethlehem Centers nearer to us. Sometimes it just amazes me how many missions like this that we can support because we have the number of women who together can make a difference.


