These items will complete the kits and allow them to be sent to a community in need. Collect one item, two items, or all three. Work gloves should have a leather palm or be all leather; re-usable wipes such as Hand-iwipes (no terrycloth, microfiber or paper towels); ROLLS, not boxes, of 24 count heavy-duty trash bags (33 gallon or larger). United Methodist Women Reading Program 2020

The Reading Program is a cherished United Methodist Women tradition that brings together members in mission as they explore, share and discuss program books. The books are available for all ages and reading levels. Reading program books are divided into 5 categories: Education For Mission, Leadership Development, Nurturing For Community, Social Action and Spiritual Growth.

There are 4 plans.

Plan I. 5 books per year 1 book in each category

Plan II: 10 books per year 2 in each category.

Plan III: 15 books per year 2 books from each category plus 5 additional books from any category including youth and children's titles.

Plan IV: 20 books per year plus 10 additional books from any category.

Children and youth books count for any level of the plan. Regular reading of **response** magazine is part of the Reading Program.

Participating in the Reading Program will raise consciousness of our social, economic and political realities, including the interconnectedness of race, class and gender in women's lives.

Hello and Happy New Year!

I hope you had a good year in 2019 and pray that you will have a happy and prosperous year in 2020. I am looking forward to the Metro District Annual Prayer Breakfast that will be held On Saturday, April 25, 2020 at Williamson's Chapel, 5757 Brawley School Road, Mooresville, NC. The theme for this event is *JOY—Jesus, Others, Yourself*. Breakfast will be served beginning at 8:30 a.m. The cost will be \$7.50 per person.

The Hands-on Project is Hygiene Kits made with materials as follows:

One hand towel (15x25-17x27 inches). No kitchen cleaning, or microfiber towels

One washcloth. No kitchen, cleaning, or microfiber washcloths.

One comb—Sturdy, with at least 6 inches of teeth; no pocket combs or picks; rattail, and combs without handles are acceptable but must have at least 6" of teeth.

One toenail or fingernail clipper-no emery boards or metal nail files.

Bath-size soap (3 oz. bars or larger); no Ivory or Jergens soap. Do no remove from packaging.

One adult toothbrush. Do not remove from packaging. Personal advertising not acceptable.

10 adhesive bandages (3/4 by 3 inches); common household bandages acceptable

One one-gallon size re-sealable bag.

Include \$2.00 for toothpaste and shipping. Make checks payable to Metro District UMW.

Assembly instructions for Hygiene Kits are as follows:

Lay hand towel flat on a table; lay wash cloth in the center of the hand towel.

Place all remaining items on top of the washcloth, except the plastic bag.

Fold the sides of the hand towel to cover the items. Grasp the bundle tightly and roll over the remainder of the towel. Place the tightly rolled bundle in the plastic bag, remove air, and seal.

Important Notes: All items must be new (do not wash any items as they will not be considered new).

Do not include personal notes, money, or additional materials in the kits. Contents of kits or the containers of kits should not be imprinted with cartoon character, advertisements, religious, patriotic, military or camouflage symbols.

Remember to send in your list of 2019 deceased United Methodist Women members so their information can be listed in the program. Please submit to me, **no later than April 1, 2020, to** 3011 Fairmead Drive, Concord NC 28025 or email to me at Kay3tom12@carolina.rr.com.






