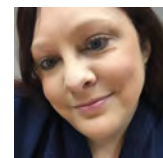

It will help ground us spiritually as we do our work and live out our UMW Purpose as disciples of Jesus. In April, the speaker for our annual Prayer Breakfast will be Northern Piedmont District Superintendent Rev. Bev Copley, and the theme will be "Called by Name." Our Social Action workshop will focus on breaking the school-to-prison pipeline. District Annual Celebration and Local Unit Officers Training will take place in August and November respectively. **And thanks to ALL of you for helping us to meet our financial goal of increasing our Conference giving in the Gift to Mission Channel by at least \$3,000.** Our District's giving in this channel actually increased by \$841.63 from 2018. Our total giving last year was \$109,231.79. Unfortunately, this amount was \$8,369.79 less than was given in 2018. Our Undesignated Giving totaled \$92,147.33, which means **we were \$12,852.67 short of meeting our pledge of \$105,000.** While this is disturbing news, with a lot of prayer and hard work, we can meet our 2020 pledge of \$100,000. Let's all do our part to make this a reality this year!

**Our 2020 Financial Goal is to "Increase Unit Pledge Giving by at least \$5 per member."** We all know how inflation has impacted the dollar. Today, \$5 does not buy what it did in 2000; we need to keep that in mind. To remain in mission as we have in the past, we must each do our part by increasing our pledge. **If your unit has not yet sent in your pledge form for 2020, please have your treasurer enclose it with your unit's first quarter remittance.** Remember that in order to meet the first criteria for becoming a Mission Today Unit, a pledge must be made and met.

I look forward to seeing and working with you at our upcoming District and Conference events for this year. We have a lot of work to do to fulfill our responsibility to God and to the United Methodist Women.

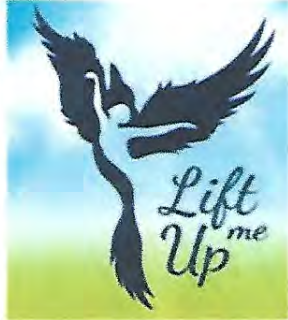

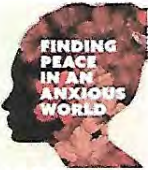
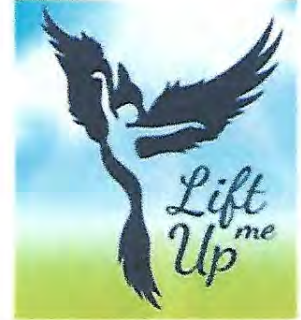
