


#### From Debra Lawson, District Nominations Chair

From Joyce Irby, District Social Action

"Maternal Mortality --- A Social Action Issue"

Happy New Year, my UMW Sisters,

It is 2020 and there is still much to be done as we seek to follow our heritage and our mission. We live in one of the richest and most highly developed countries in the world, but our maternal mortality rate increased 26.4%. We are the only developed country whose rate did not decline. That should not be!

We need to call on healthcare workers, lawmakers and advocates to fund maternal mortality review committees and implement recommendations in hospitals and communities.

Here are a few of the issues: 1. Many women are unable to access proper healthcare prior to, throughout and after pregnancy. 2. African American women have the highest rates of maternal mortality,

dying at three to four times the rate of white women. Native women are dying at three times the rate of white women. 3. There is a lack of communication and sharing of data between providers.

California had one of the highest rates in the country. Through strategic planning and funding, their maternal mortality rate dropped to 4.5 per 100,000 births. What did they do? They had always provided affordable insurance for the poor, but they sought out more ways to provide more money. Improvements in data sharing and training was provided. Necessary supplies for providers and patients were provided. They also required healthcare providers in prenatal care to have implicit bias training through the March of Dimes.

Of the 700 to 900 maternal deaths each year in America, the CDC Foundation estimated 60% were preventable. Also, statistics show for every woman who dies in childbirth, 70 more come close.

What can we do? We can educate ourselves using our Conference website's resources. We can contact healthcare providers in our communities to learn what's being done. We can contact our legislators to come together to fund affordable healthcare for pregnant mothers and infants.

California did it, so the HOW is clear. Now it's a matter of having the WILL and funding to make it right! Be blessed.



Days For Girls is a global movement that prepares and distributes sustainable Menstrual health solutions for girls who would otherwise miss school or work during their monthly periods.

These kits will be given to a young lady that is going to Western Africa in June. We have already given her 39 kits, but have supplies to make many more kits. We need your help.




