These items will complete the kits and allow then to be sent to a community in need. Collect one item two items, or all three Work gloves should have a leather palm or be all leather; re-usable wipes such as Handiwipes (no terrycloth, microfiber or paper towels); 24 count ROLLS, not boxes, heavy-duty trash bags (33 gallon or larger). Thank you in advance for your support!



We are experiencing very difficult times with the pandemic, violence and social unrest. I am sharing two books which relate to the current issues. The first book paints a picture of the difficulties faced by people of color and the second book tells us about eight women who were called to save the world. This may be our time to follow God's calling in our lives to make a difference in the world.

In the bonus book, Nobody Cries When We Die, Patrick B. Reyes writes that for people of color living each day surrounded by violence and for whom survival is not a given, vocational discernment is more than "finding your purpose"--it's a matter of life and death. Balancing the tension between pain and healing, this book takes you to the places that make American society flinch, redefines what you are called to do with your life, and gives you strength to save lives and lead in your community.

In the book, When Others Shuddered: Eight Women Who Refused To Give Up, by Jamie Janosz, we learn about eight women (Fanny Crosby, Mary McLeod Bethune, Nettie McCormick, Sarah Dunn Clark, Emma Dryer, Virginia Asher, Evangeline Booth and Amanda Berry Smith) who were called to serve God and change the world. Their stories inspire us to follow God's calling in our own lives and teach us that each individual person can make a difference.

History of Rocky Mount UMW

Rocky Mount UMW began in the late 1800's to early 1900's as The Missionary Society. In 1946, the Missionary Society became known as The Women's Society of Christian Service. In 1972, the United Methodist Women (as it is known today) was formed. There are four circles at Rocky Mount, named after four dedicated church women. RMUMW currently has 135 women on its role. Some of their mission projects are:
