Mission Study Update First may I thank Pineville UMC and Tonya Lanier for patience and perseverance in our previous plans – Thank You! Gathering together as we are accustomed to is still not possible. A virtual training is our only solution. We have the opportunity to join all United Methodist Women in the study 'Finding Peace in an Anxious World', edited by Erin James-Brown. Registration for the study will open on October 1, 2020 on the Conference website (https://wnccumw.org/events/mission-u-2020/). The study will be offered in one-hour segments, each evening October 26-29th. Sandrea Williamson will be our teacher. You will need to attend all four (4) one-hour sessions. Since it will be virtual, you will be able to enjoy the workshop in the comfort of your home – or back yard, local park or wherever you would like!

Hands-On Mission Project Since we will not gather as a group, I am asking you to arrange delivery of your Hands-on Mission supplies. The Mission Study items: work gloves, reusable wipes and trash bag rolls should be delivered to the Mission Response Center, 8973 Greenwood Road, Terrell, NC. Brian Mateer, Associate Director of Missional Engagement, is the contact to arrange a deliver date; please contact him at 704-714-2340. There are set days for drop off, but COVID has made even a schedule hard to guarantee; please make an appointment with Brian before traveling to the Mission Response Center. And please coordinate with surrounding units if possible – to reduce the number of trips, conserve gasoline, etc. If you have collected Hygiene Kits, these will go to the Mission Response Center as well. The shipping money for these can be sent to Kim Shaffer, Metro Treasurer with your quarterly remittance. Take School Supplies or kits to the Alliance Center for Education (previously known as the Bethlehem Center) 5701 Executive Center, Charlotte NC. Be sure to label the school supplies that you drop off as OST (Out of School Time). If you would like to donate items to the Alliance Center for Education and have not purchased them yet, there is a link to Amazon with a wish list for school items. These would go to the classrooms and children in the Early Head Start and Head Start programs. Simply click on the link and shop. Items will be delivered directly to Alliance Center for Education. https://a.co/hcal.661

For our annual report I will still need a 'count' of what we have collected. Please send the number of items (number of kits, number of supplies & type) donated and for the loose/individual items their estimate value. Example: 3 pairs work gloves, \$14.99 or 75 notebooks \$1.00 each.

<u>Midnight Teacher</u>, by Janet Halfmann, is a book that tells the remarkable story of Lilly Ann Granderson, an enslaved woman, who was sold after her mother's death. Her master's children had taught her to read using a ragged blue-back speller which Lily used to teach others on the plantation. Lily was sold to a man from Mississippi, where it was illegal for slaves to learn to read.

Although she faced harsher penalties she expanded her education efforts. Patrollers caught Lily leading her school. The punishment was 39 lashes. However, they found no law against a slave teaching a slave. This book has detailed, realistic illustrations using acrylic paint and colored pencils. The artwork shows Lily Ann's determination to improve lives through literacy.

My prayer is that as the pandemic, civil unrest and other concerns continue; that God will keep you safe and well.

HISTORIAN

Bethlehem Center of Charlotte Gets Rebranded

In the February 2020 issue of the Western North Carolina Conference Gram, Betty Durham, WNCC UMW Historian, and Lynda Morris, Metro District President and BCC Board Member wrote an article that gave a brief history of the Bethlehem Center of Charlotte (BCC).

"Founded by United Methodist Women in 1940, the Bethlehem Center of Charlotte (BCC) is a National Mission Institution operating in a covenant relationship with United Methodist Women. BCC started in Charlotte's Brooklyn Community (now called First Ward) to address the need for temporary housing and other services for women and children whose income was at or below the poverty level. In 1956 after Charlotte's Urban Renewal, BCC's headquarters were relocated and its services expanded to include a kindergarten, activities for older children and youth, and parenting classes. BCC has branched out from its original location to 13 locations across Mecklenburg County, serving over 800 children in a Head Start pre-school setting."

2020 marks the 80th anniversary for Bethlehem Center of Charlotte. On August 20, CEO William McDonald excitedly announced a name change for BCC. The new name is **ALLIANCE CENTER for EDUCA-TION.** With the celebration of the 80th anniversary, the BCC Board felt it was an opportune time to "update the brand to more accurately reflect the center's ties to education, upward mobility and equality". The name change and rebranding enhances the center's vision to "positively affect the future of children at risk by improving their economic mobility through education". The mission remains the same and the connection with United Methodist Women has not been severed. The Center looks forward to continuing its work to impact children into the future.
