

God has given us a Cornucopia filled Fruits of the Spirit. We are going to look at some of these over the next few newsletters for a deeper understanding. We will begin with:

Love

The greatest and most important of all the fruit is Love, for it is the highest attribute of God. His entire persona is love. The Bible has much to say about this fruit. Solomon says "it is stronger than death" in 8:6 and God himself "is love" according to I John 4:16. Jeremiah tells us "he has loved us with an everlasting love (31:3).

There are a variety of words in Greek for love, but the kind of love God talks to us about is called "Agape". It is an unconditional kind of love, the type of love He has for us.
