

From Joyce Irby, District Social Action

Greetings My UMW Sisters,

Thanks be to God for His mercy, grace and love during these unprecedented times.

I was able to share with the UMW of Ardmore as their Women's Day speaker about racial justice issues. With the UMW of Sharon, we did a brief study on the School to Prison Pipeline. This refers to the way children of color are funneled from the school to detention facilities to prison in unprecedented proportions. 31% of the students with school-based arrests are African-American which only make-up 16% of the total school population. An average of 250 preschool children were suspended or expelled every school day of 2016. Native American students are less than 1% of the student population but comprise 3% of school expulsions.

Some of the issues that causes these outcomes are implicit racial and gender biases; zero-tolerance policies and excessive out-of-school suspensions and expulsions.

I will share this fact from our Fact Sheet. Many people wrongly assume that children and youth of color are more frequently arrested because they commit more crimes than their white peers. In fact, children and youth of color do not misbehave more frequently; they are simply treated more harshly for similar or lesser offenses.

What can you do?

- 1. Educate yourself and share it with others.
- 2. Bring your gifts to the table and join a local effort.
- 3. Support local youth leaders. Listen to the voices of children and youth of color to learn from them and take their stories to heart.

As an African-American woman and teacher, I found that I too had biases that caused me to assume behaviors about my students. I discussed those issues with my students and had to make some changes in my disciplinary actions. If students feel that you are not fair in the classroom, they will not trust you or listen to you eventually.
