We have been very fortunate & blessed to continue to do our work through zoom and other technological means.

One of the things we have to look forward to is our District Annual Meeting that will be coming in August & we will be having a wonderful speaker whom some of you may have heard before. Dr. Arnetta Beverly is an inspiration and always has a very meaningful message. So mark your calendars to not forget August 21st. The place will be announced at a later date and if we cannot meet together we will do it virtually as we did this past year.

Another exciting mission trip that I want to tell you about is to Peru! You may be saying—"I'm not going to travel to Peru now or ever!!" This is even better because you will not have to get on a plane or leave your home in any way! Many of you may have dreamed of going on a mission trip to a foreign country but was afraid to fly, did not have the money, or time, etc, etc. But this is a way to meet and see the United Methodist Women in Peru and do it through your computer!! Happy New Year 2021! Goodbye 2020!



Climate Justice, with a particular focus on Just Energy 4 All campaign.

Maternal_Health during this time of COVID is still crucial with our overburdened health systems, and Economic Justice looms large considering current lost jobs, unemployment, and poor pay for essential workers.

Every unit has access to the conference standing rules by going to the conference UMW webpage: www.wnccumw.org and looking under "downloads available."

- 1. There is a new handbook available on the national website (<u>www.unitedmethodistwomen.org</u>) that can be downloaded.
- 2. Regarding agendas: This is the correct way to accept minutes during meetings: Minutes...The President asks the Secretary to read the minutes of the previous meeting **OR** if the Secretary has emailed the minutes, presents the minutes as emailed or printed. (This is more likely to happen.) President calls for "Any corrections to the minutes?" Pause, then "The minutes are approved as read/emailed/printed." If the minutes have been corrected, then the President says: "The minutes are approved as corrected." NO SECOND, NO VOTE! Minutes should always be signed: "Jane Doe, Secretory." (Do NOT sign "Respectfully submitted! this is no longer correct)
- 3. Regarding treasurer's report: After the treasurer's report the president will give the opportunity for questions and then will say "The treasurer's report is filed for audit." No vote is needed. Vickie Brown, Former Parliamentarian

The first 27 pages are the English version, but you may want the Spanish or Korean version too and they are on this site too. Also included are a list of reading plans and a place to record the books you read. Under bonus books, you will find that participating in 3 faith talks can be used as one book. Each unit may want to assign one person the job of printing this list out, seeing how many books are already available from your library and encouraging the librarians to order some of these books. All reading plans require regular reading of response magazine. This can be ordered by going to www.unitedmethodistwomen.org and clicking on the News banner at the top of the page. This will show a dropdown and the last entry is the response magazine. By clicking on this entry, you will be routed to a page which gives detailed directions on ordering a digital or print copy. Don't forget that a book review or simply a synopsis is helpful in promoting the reading program. Until our country can establish herd immunity to the virus many of us are homebound, and reading is a wonderful way to travel outside ourselves and communities as well as to learn many and different ideas. 


