

MEMBERSHIP, NURTURE AND OUTREACH

As we affirm the purpose of our organization on a regular basis, we remind ourselves that an important part of our purpose is to "expand our concept of mission through the participation in the global ministries of the church." There is no better way, I believe, to do this than to stay informed and the best way we have of doing that is to read, read, read. Read *response* magazine and read the recommended books on the UMW Reading List for a greater understanding of the issues our world is facing. One such book is entitled "Hospitable Planet: Faith, Action, and Climate Change." The author is Stephen A. Jurovics. Mr. Jurovics combines his knowledge as an Engineer along with his love for the scriptures (especially those Jesus studied, referred to as the law in Genesis, Exodus, Leviticus, Numbers and Deuteronomy) to address the "ecological crises" we are in today.

The book is presented in three different parts with the first part establishing God's creation and what he expects from humankind in return for his good gift. About 45 percent of the book is used to illustrate what God intended when he gave humankind dominion over the earth. Part 2 deals with taking action at the national level and Part 3 challenges us to take action, individually and in our local communities.

True. Climate change has become a political issue; but long before it became a political issue, it was an issue for us as human beings in our covenantal relationship with our God. We forgot to stay in relationship with God. We forgot to honor that sabbath day that was set aside for us to rest our bodies and our souls. In our quest for food, we became hardened in our treatment of animals and we have only to drive past the slaughtering houses in the midwest to witness the ill treatment of beef cattle or pass a huge truck on the highway loaded with chickens packed in small spaces unable to breathe, resulting in many dying before reaching their destination, as a result. The list continues. Please read this book. It will change your life!

Mr. Jurovics ends his book with the following statement for us to ponder, "Our descendants would never forgive our choosing expediency over preserving a hospitable planet. When people driven more by faith than science join forces with those driven more by science than faith, their union will form the Environmental Rights Movement that will stabilize the earth's climate and preserve God's creation."
