We are already in our 3rd Quarter of 2021! I hope you were able to attend our virtual Conference Spiritual Growth Retreat in June. Our speaker, Lisa Beth White, did an awesome job. Also, I hope you attended our virtual “Wear a hat – Bring a hat” Tea on June 5. Martha Isenberg presented an informative message on the benefits of tea and mindful meditation. We learned a lot and had fun!

If you have internet access, I hope you will read some of the other District’s Newsletters. I enjoy reading what other Districts are doing, and most recently read an article by Beverly Bard, Acting M E & I Coordinator in Smoky Mountain District, with some history of Sager-Brown. I would like to share this as some of you may not know (as I did not) the history. Beverly wrote “Sager-Brown rose from the ashes of the Civil War in 1867, serving as an orphanage for African-American children. Known as ‘The Orphan Home’, Sager-Brown developed into an elite school for African-Americans teaching cooking, farming, and basic literacy. As the school began to struggle financially, Dr. Godman, a Methodist missionary, gathered several of the young ladies and began a tour of the northern states as ‘Jubilee Singers’. This group so impressed Mrs. Sager and Mrs. Brown that they purchased the school and they ran it a few years and gave it to what is now the United Methodist Women in 1921. The school was renamed Sager-Brown Orphanage and Goodman School, and continued operating until the doors were closed in 1978.

The property was put on the market and never sold. Hurricane Andrew hit that area in 1992 and caused widespread property damage. The property is five feet above sea level. This property suffered little damage and the General Board of Global Ministries and UMCOR recognized that the property was a place to coordinate UMCOR relief efforts, and it became a relief center. Volunteers came and did repairs in the community and relief efforts went on for 3 years. UMCOR realized a need for a permanent facility to respond to natural disasters, so a 48,000 sq. ft. Depot was built in 1995. UMCOR owns the Depot (where our relief kits are sent), but the United Methodist Women owns the property (25 acres) that it sits on and 12 buildings.” After our UMW relief kits are collected and taken to our drop-off center in Mooresville, they are then sent to Sager-Brown. This is another story we can share with our Units to know more about where some of our mission dollars are used!

If you have not sent your 2021 pledge to me, please do so. This helps our officers set our 2022 District Pledge, which helps the Conference officers set our Conference Pledge to allow the National office to determine how our mission dollars can be distributed to our mission projects!

In these times when so many have lost so much may we give as the poor widow did, for the least of these.
