

## **Standing Rules**

# ARTICLE VIIRULES OF ORDER FOR THE APPALACHIAN DISTRICTUNITED METHODIST WOMEN ANNUAL MEETING

#### SECTION 1 GENERAL INFORMATION

Meetings shall open and close at the times stipulated in the official program.

#### **SECTION 2 NEW BUSINESSES**

A. All new business that has not been considered by the Executive Committee of the District shall be presented in writing to the Secretary seven (7) days prior to being considered by the voting delegates.

Proposed resolutions must be submitted in writing to the District President sixty (60) days prior to the beginning of the District Annual Meeting.

#### SECTION 3 MOTIONS

A. All motions except on matters of procedure shall be written and signed by the maker and furnished to the Chair before action is taken.

The Secretary, unless directed otherwise, shall not record motions ruled out of order, points of order on which no appeal is taken, or trivial matters of privilege.

#### **SECTION 4 DEBATES**

A. In seeking recognition from the Chairperson, a member must stand to address the Chair and, on being recognized, state her or his name before making comment or motion.

The maker of a motion, in preference to any other delegate, shall be entitled to the floor immediately after the motion is stated. Debate shall be limited to fifteen (15) minutes per topic.

No member shall speak to a motion a second time until all others have been given the opportunity to speak. No member shall speak more than twice on the same questions, nor more than two (2) minutes at one time, without the consent of the body.

General consent shall be required if additional time is to be given.

#### **SECTION 5 VOTING MEMBERSHIP**

The voting body of the Appalachian District shall be composed of local unit members in attendance.

#### SECTION 6 QUORUM

A quorum shall be a simple majority of the membership present representing the units in the District.

#### ARTICLE VIII PARLIAMENTARY AUTHORITY

*Robert's Rules of Order*, Newly Revised Edition, shall be the parliamentary authority. A two-thirds vote of the members present is required to suspend or amend these rules

#### ARTICLE VIV AMENDMENT OF STANDING RULES

The District Executive Committee may amend the Standing Rules upon recommendation. *NOTE:* For further information on policies from the Conference and United Methodist Women, Inc., refer to the Standing Rules of the Western North Carolina Conference United Methodist Women.

I realize that I am writing a report for the year 2021, but I feel this is vital to our needs as we celebrate 2020 to see what has changed for us as a District this year. I hope you will find some enlightenment in my perspective on this. I thank you in advance.

This year as we continued with the COVID 19 issues and struggled to re-group and revise our way of dealing with contagious diseases, we have seen a change in our church family and our United Methodist Women. We have seen a change in our world and we have grown in acceptance of our humanness as we have struggled with the unknown, while we along with our neighbors, have deepened our faith in the One who holds us in the palm of His hand and whom we know holds the future.


We held our Mission Study with the Reverend Lisa Beth White leading us as we learned about our heritage "Women United for Change: 150 Years in Mission". The handson-mission for this event was for kits for UMCOR. We collected Hygiene Kits and School Kits. Our Purpose states it well, "The organized unit of United Methodist Women shall be a community of women whose purpose is to know God and to experience freedom as whole persons through Jesus Christ, to develop a creative, supportive fellowship; and to expand concepts of mission through participation in the global ministries of the church."

## APPALACHIAN DISTRICT UNITED METHODIST WOMEN ZOOM WEBINAR ANNUAL MEETING AUGUST 29, 2020

Lynne Gilbert, Conference Webmaster, welcomed attendees and provided technical tips for the Zoom Webinar. Julia Willis, WNCC UMW President, greeted attendees and provided information about the Legacy Fund and the upcoming Virtual WNCC Annual Celebration. Nancy Reigel, WNCC UMW Treasurer, gave a presentation on Mission Giving and options for giving our District love offering.

District President Sherry Summerlin welcomed all; introduced the gathering music, "We've a Story to Tell to the Nation"; and opened the meeting by asking all to join in our Statement of Purpose followed by Pastor Karen Roberts of Wilkesboro UMC delivering the Invocation. Judy Sipe, District Spiritual Growth Coordinator, shared mission witness, mission focus, and birthdays from the Prayer Calendar and Roberta Walker, District Mission Education and Interpretation Coordinator, gave the Mission Moment from response magazine, focusing on women's health and using various-sized beads as an aid to detect breast cancer. She encouraged all to be diligent about getting mammograms. Roberta also provided information and a reminder for our Conference Hands On Mission projects. Sherry Mabry, standing in for our District Social Action Coordinator, Donna Parks Hill, reminded us that we need to "get off the fence"; "take a stand" for Social Justice issues; and remember that we are many women, with many voices and many outreach ways. Our speaker, Rev. Karen Roberts, spoke about the living light of Christ; how the world in the midst of Covid-19 can be overwhelming and seem dark and scary. She offered advice to "close our eyes, count to 10, and when we open our eyes they will have adjusted to the darkness and things don't seem so dark and scary. She referenced John 1:4-5 and John 8:12; both scriptures refer to the living light, our Christ. Our Love Offering was given as a Gift to Mission honoring and affirming Clergywomen: past, present and future.

We celebrated the local units for 2019 mission accomplishments. Unit accomplishments were announced by Sherry and noted in our program book for Mission Today, 5 Channels of Giving, increase in membership, Mission Study, Justice Today, and Reading Program participation. Sherry informed all that certificates will be mailed to Unit Presidents. Our program book also indicates Gift to Mission and Gift in Memory honorees.

We then moved to the business portion of the meeting with Sherry Summerlin, President, presiding and calling the business meeting to order at 11 a.m. Nancy Johnson, Treasurer, presented the proposed budget for 2021. The proposed budget for Administration & Membership Development (A&MD) was \$5,800.00 and was approved; the proposed Pledge to Mission was \$52,000 and was approved. Brenda Kimberlin, Chair of the Committee on Nominations, presented the following proposed slate of officers for a two-year term (2021-2022). No nominations from the floor were received 10 days prior to this meeting.

- To change your name on your computer image, right click on your image, select RENAME and type in your preferred name.
- To view a list of all participants, left click PARTICIPANT on lower Zoom screen. Participants will appear on right of screen.
- To raise your hand to speak, click the RAISE HAND option at the bottom.
- If you want to key a message on the screen, select CHAT at the bottom of the Zoom screen and key your message into the box.
