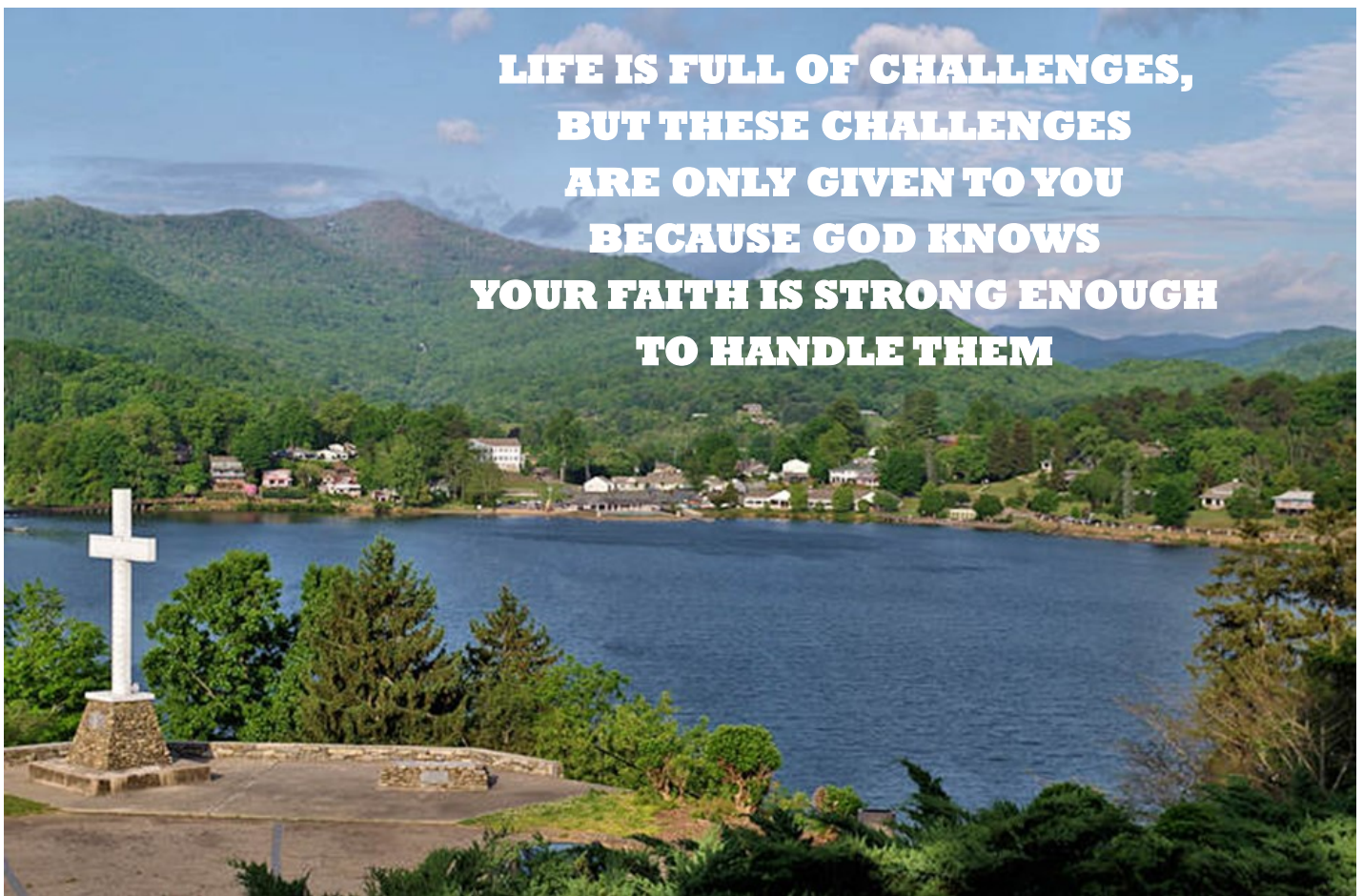

REPORT OF THE SECRETARY

This Program and Annual Report serve as the official minutes of the 2021 Metro District Annual Celebration held at St. Stephen United Methodist Church, Charlotte, North Carolina on Saturday, August 28, 2021. The Rules of Order for the District Annual Celebration are hereby included in this Program and Annual Report Book.

RULES OF ORDER FOR DISTRICT ANNUAL CELEBRATION

1. GENERAL INFORMATION

Celebrations shall open at the time stipulated in the Official Program

2. NEW BUSINESS

New Business that has not been considered by the Executive Committee of the District shall be presented in writing to the Secretary, seven (7) days prior to the Annual Celebration at which it is to be proposed.

3. MOTIONS

- a. All motions, except on matters of procedure, shall be written and signed by the maker and furnished to the Chair before action is taken.
- b. The Secretary, unless directed otherwise, shall not record motions ruled out of order, points of order on which an appeal is made, or trivial matters of privilege.

4. DEBATE

- a. In seeking recognition from the Chair, a member must stand to address the Chair, on being recognized, state his/her name before making a comment or motion.
- b. The mover of the motion in preference to any other member shall be entitled to the floor immediately after the motion is stated.
- c. No person shall speak to a motion a second time until all other persons have been given an opportunity to speak.
- d. No person shall speak more than twice on the same question nor more than (2) two minutes at one time without the consent of the body.
- e. General consent shall be required if additional time is to be given.

5. QUORUM

A quorum shall be a simple majority of the membership registered.

6. PARLIMENTARY AUTHORITY

- a. Robert's Rules of Order Newly Revised shall be the parliamentary authority.
- b. A two-thirds (2/3) vote of the membership present is required to suspend or amend the rules.

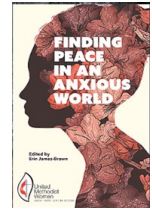
