Upcoming Book Study on Economic Inequality



Did you know?

- By 2014, 71% of American workers earned less than \$50,000 a year, and 38% earned less than \$20,000 a year.
- Since 2008, the wealthiest 1 percent of Americans have seen incomes increase by 31.4%, while everyone else's grew by less than half a percent.
- By 2016, the wealthiest 62 people on Earth controlled as much wealth as 3.8 billion people.

And that hardly scratches the surface of shocking statistics on this subject. The fact that many have had their hours cut or lost their jobs during the pandemic, and many small businesses have struggled and been forced to close, while the richest corporations are gaining by leaps and bounds, has just deepened the severe economic divide between the ultra-wealthy and average people.

If you're intrigued to learn more, please attend one or both sessions of my upcoming book study on *We Are All Fast-Food Workers Now: the Global Uprising Against Poverty Wages* by Annelise Orleck. We'll meet two Saturdays, Oct. 30 and Nov. 6, from 10 a.m. to 12 noon.

We'll discuss poverty wages in the U.S. and globally, fast fashion and agricultural work. **Though reading the book before the study may be helpful, it is not required.** We will examine the topics at hand primarily through

stories of real workers. This study will balance realism and ambition, addressing serious, urgent issues but also celebrating progress and providing hope for real change. Hope to see you there! You can also call and listen in. **See pg. 6 to contact me or any officer for assistance.**



Remain in Mission!

Question: How does the Northern Piedmont District of United Methodist Women do a local Hands-on Mission project? **Answer #1**: Prior to March 2020, we had in-person Prayer Breakfasts, District Celebrations, Mission Studies, etc. and were given a "theme" for items to collect. Ex: when we heard a presentation from Healthy Moms, Healthy Babies at the start of 2020, we gathered a mountain of baby supplies.

Answer #2: After March 2020, NO in-person events, so no collection of items. What now?

When the year's end came, it was time to complete the Mission tally sheets for the Conference. That form basically has three sections: UMCOR Missions, AGAPE Missions and an Events section. Perhaps needless to say, we had VERY LITTLE to report with no in-person events.

For United Methodist Women, being in Mission is not a choice; it is the reason for our very existence. Mission Studies, Prayer Breakfasts, District Celebrations, the Reading Program, etc. are all important. But they are meant to equip us, enable us and encourage us to BE IN MISSION. It is not a matter of IF, but a matter of HOW!

So, about a year ago, I started cold-calling around the District to find local Mission opportunities: food pantries, soup kitchens, shelters, YMCAs, youth programs, women's programs. We began to list some of these needs in the newsletter along with addresses and phone numbers. Later, we named this section "Step Up & Reach Out." Any items donated and reported will be counted on our year-end tally sheet under Events (we'll count each newsletter as an event).

It's kinda funny how hard it is to get someone on the phone if they don't already know you. I guess we are all burned out from the assault of telemarketers daily. Trying to squeeze in "United Methodist Women" and "Do you need donations?" before they hang up is challenging, even for a talker like me.



2020 UNITED METHODIST WOMEN GODWINK MOMENTS:



Squire D. Rushnell, also known as SQuire Rushnell, is an American author, inspirational speaker, a former television executive who led *Good Morning America* to first place for the first time, and was a father of *Schoolhouse Rock* which shared 75 Emmy's with The ABC Afterschool Specials. His books in the *When God Winks* series have appeared on the New York Times bestseller list.

God-wink to some is a new word and it is another way to tell of the wonderful works of God; defined, "As an event or personal experience, often identified as coincidence, so astonishing that it is seen as a sign of divine intervention, especially when perceived as the answer to a prayer."

During year 2020 there were many coincidences, interventions, answered prayers and more. March 2020 changed all our lives so alternative ways to worship; execute rituals for weddings, baptisms, funerals were different. Impact from the pandemic reflected in our meetings, education experiences, work, the acquisition of goods and services, entertainment and fitness, our dress, travel, health care, use of technology and more. United Methodist Women in the Northern Piedmont District should share <u>Godwink moments</u> to inspire humankind. Godwinks inspired transformations relative to our prayers and Bible study and isolation allowed us to rediscover the resilience, creativity, faith and resourcefulness within us that we were too busy to notice beforehand. Now is the time to pass on the helpful knowledge or experiences we lived in a poem, prose, short-story, testimonial, or other format. What a blessing these would be for our district and conference from its women of God.

WHAT TO DO? Each District-5 United Methodist Women president shall get an email. She and/or her designee would record a god-wink moment from a member or your unit, insert your name and church in the subject line then forward each Saturday to the next UMW president from a NPD alpha list attachment. This communication style is comparable to a chain letter and the responses would occur within 7 days after its receipt from the previous president. Why emails? ...electronic transmittals do not require postage, email reduces the need to paper copy or retain for record retention, and this exercise improves communication amongst district organizations sometimes not possible in 2020. The first UMW organization would receive this notification beginning **July 24** and the cycle ends **November 30, 2021**. Those without technology would mail their god-winks directly to me or Lily Pierce by Saturday October 2, 2021.

Beginning July 24, Tag You Are It! Reminder: when it's your turn process your moment and please keep the God-winks moving as scheduled. *Thanks, for sharing!*





The bus trip package price includes: Deluxe bus transportation provided by Holiday Tours, six nights lodging (Tuesday night May 17th thru Sunday night May 22nd), certain meals while traveling (4 lunches, 2 dinners, 2 breakfasts). **Important note:** The trip price includes 4 hotel nights in Orlando during the Assembly at the Rosen Plaza Hotel and 2 hotel nights while traveling at the Holiday Inn Express Savannah Historic District. Passengers do not need to make any separate hotel reservations. ALL nights are included in the bus package price.

The bus trip package price <u>DOES NOT</u> include the Assembly Registration Fee. <u>Register for the Assembly ONLINE</u> at www.assembly2022.org. The Assembly 2022 registration fee is \$330.00 per person if you register ONLINE on or before November 30, 2021. After that date, the registration fee goes up \$30. Register early to take advantage of the discount! If you need assistance with online registration, contact Lynne Gilbert or Sara Williams for assistance. Note: Two lunches are included in the Assembly registration fee. Links to Assembly online registration & other information are also available on our website at: www.wnccumw.org.

COVID-19 Information: We will be following COVID-19 safety protocols, as will Holiday Tours. **Proof of vaccinations** will be required to travel on the bus and **must be submitted with your reservation on our COVID-19 Information form.**

Complete and return the form below, along with a \$500 deposit, by November 10, 2021. (A separate form and \$500 deposit is required for each person making a reservation.)

Make your reservations early! Bus reservations will be accepted in the order they are received until seating capacity is reached. Payment of the balance will be due by February 15, 2022.

There will be no refunds for cancellations after March 15, 2022 (unless it becomes necessary for WNCC-UMW to cancel the trip).

I agree to release, indemnify, hold harmless, and covenant not to sue Lynne Gilbert, Sara Williams, or Western North Carolina Conference United Methodist Women and its agents, volunteers, representatives, or any other person involved either directly or indirectly, from all claims, suits, expenses, attorney fees and demands of any nature (including negligence) caused by, deriving from, or associated with my travel. I make these covenants, release and waivers knowingly and voluntarily. It is further understood and agreed that this travel assumption of risk, release and indemnity agreement is to be binding on my heirs and assigns and I am signing of my own free will.
