People fleeing desolate lives in their home countries are stuck in refugee camps in Mexico as they await a chance to enter the US. We learned about this from Deaconess Cindy Johnson who is a deaconess in the Rio Grande Conference. She works with La Posada Providencia to provide shelter to immigrants and help with their resettlement in Texas. This is a mission of UMW. For many years she has helped provide medicine to people in the refugee camp. The video can be accessed for sharing in local units. Let me know if you would be interested.

Our next event is our leadership development/missions festival on November 20th. It will again be by zoom but I believe all will find the time spent well worthwhile. You can register on the wnccumw.org web site under district names. We will be talking about year- end report forms but also how to lead with creativity. Officer descriptions are being developed and will be shared when complete. If you have questions about a particular office that you feel called to do, you will want to check these out. This is for everyone not just local officers.

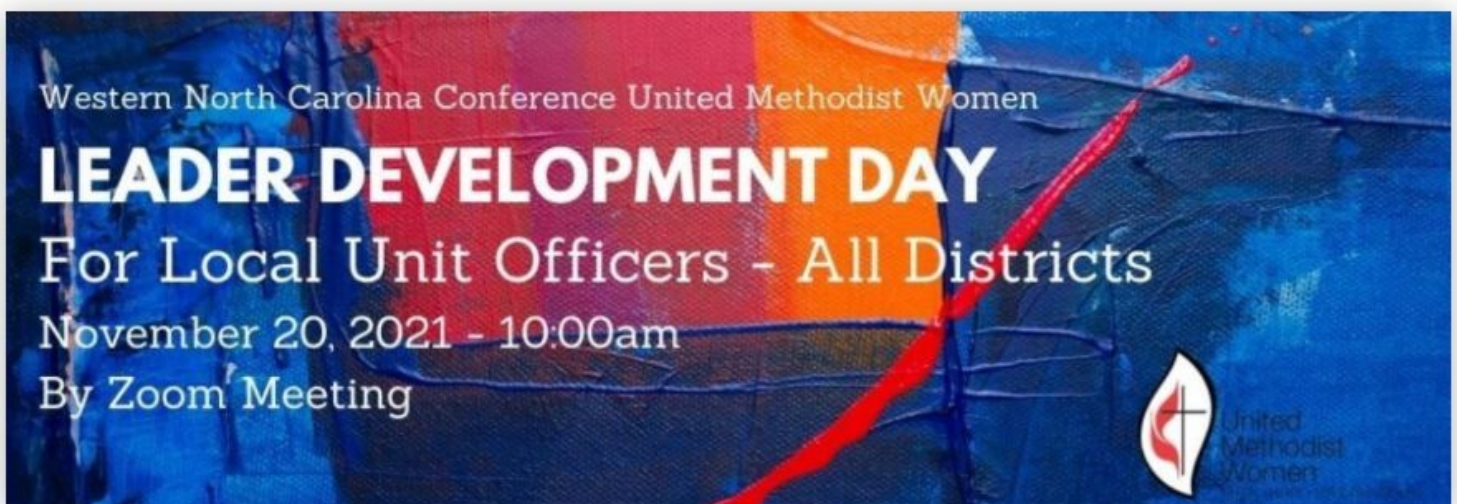


OUR SPIRITUAL GROWTH ARENA

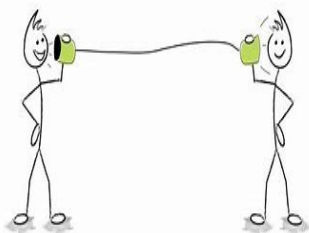

We will be following COVID-19 health safety protocols, as will Holiday Tours. **Proof of vaccinations is required to travel on the bus and must be submitted with your Bus Trip Reservation Form by November 10, 2021. If booster vaccination guidelines are announced, proof of booster vaccinations will also be required.**

Commitment / Covenant for all Passengers: I covenant and agree to the following with regard to travel to Orlando on the Western North Carolina Conference United Methodist Women Assembly bus trip:

- I am providing a valid copy of my COVID-19 vaccination record.
- I will not travel if I have been in close contact with a confirmed case of COVID-19 in the 14 days prior to departure. I will not travel if I have had a fever of 100.4 or more in the last 48 hours prior to departure, or if I am experiencing cough, shortness of breath, sore throat, loss of taste or smell in last 14 days, or vomiting or diarrhea in the last 24 hours.
- I will check my temperature within 24 hours of departure and I will not travel unless it is below 100.4 degrees.

Indemnification: I understand that I am travelling at my own risk. I agree to release, indemnify, hold harmless, and covenant not to sue Lynne Gilbert, Sara Williams, or Western North Carolina Conference United Methodist Women and its agents, volunteers, representatives, or any other person involved either directly or indirectly, from all claims, suits, expenses, attorney fees and demands of any nature (including negligence) caused by, deriving from, or associated with my travel. I make these covenants, release and waivers knowingly and voluntarily. It is further understood and agreed that this travel assumption of risk, release and indemnity agreement is to be binding on my heirs and assigns and I am signing of my own free will.

Holiday Tours Protocols for Infectious Diseases: *On behalf of all passengers, the Group Leader/Lessee recognizes and acknowledges that there are certain inherent risks associated with infectious diseases, including COVID-19, and accepts full responsibility for personal injury to themselves or others in their party. Group Leader/Lessee understands and agrees that if, after boarding, or even if a Passenger has fully complied with all wellness policies and procedures, if a Passenger tests positive for an infectious disease or exhibits signs or symptoms, Holiday may remove said passenger, refuse reboarding, and remove the Passenger as well as members of the Passenger's travelling party, or take other steps which Holiday determines, in its sole discretion, are necessary under the circumstances to protect the health and well-being of others. Each such Passenger is responsible for all other related costs and fines, including without limitation travel expenses.
