Greetings, my UMW Sisters,

I want to share some information from <u>the children's defense fund</u>: <u>Leave No Child Behind</u>. It was titled, "Listening and Acting to Heal Our Children."

I have been substituting in the schools since August and I see what is going on in the schools to a certain degree. Some of the problems are not enough staff, transportation problems, adjusting to inperson learning (and want to sleep or just talk), bullying in the upper grades and now more violent acts whether it's from youth themselves or other sources. The impact of these crises on our children's mental health is alarming and has increased.

What can schools do: use the Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief (ESSER) Fund to: *Prioritize students' mental health with programs for youth and their families.

Policies that promote the school-to-prison pipeline must be dismantled. All students need a safe and supportive environment to learn.

CDF Freedom Schools program was proud to serve in 72 cities across this country this summer providing support to the whole family with social-emotional learning and culturally based literacy instruction.

My sisters, let us fervently pray for our children because they are 'Our Future'!

^{*}Expand the school-based behavioral workforce and prioritize equity in hiring.

^{*}Integrate social-emotional learning with culturally responsive practices.

^{*}Invest in infrastructure projects such as telehealth technology and training in technical support.

From Jamie Smith, District Treasurer

Greetings my UMW Sisters,

I hope you were able to attend the District and Conference Annual Celebrations through Zoom! While this way of meeting has saved UMW dollars and we are not having to drive distances to save our dollars, I am missing seeing all of you!

I wanted to tell you how our District budget and pledge are set each year. I am sure many of you are aware of this, but just bear with me while I inform those who may not know....I certainly did not until I became your District Treasurer!

Your District Finance Committee makes a proposal for the coming year's pledge and budget, which is voted on by the District Members at our Annual Celebration/Meeting in August. The Finance Committee bases the amount on previous giving by you, our members, through the Unit pledges and giving and your love offerings. The District Pledge we sent to Conference for 2021 was voted on in August 2020 after our unusual COVID year. It was a decrease from the previous years I have been treasurer, with the Pledge amount being \$148,000. At the end of 3rd Quarter, we had remitted to our Conference: Undesignated Giving (which is the amount toward our Pledge) = \$57,767, leaving \$90,233 to be remitted before **December 1**, (the end of our UMW year). We have a significant amount left to be collected and sent 4th Quarter! And, it is not too late to send a love offering if you choose.

Due to the circumstances facing us after 2020, the Conference Executive Committee voted to allow the five undesignated channels of giving amounts to be counted with the Pledge amount giving for 2021. Those are: *Pledge, *Special Mission Recognition, *Gift To Mission, *Gift In Memory,* World Thank Offering and *Walk for Mission. Our Pledge monies fund District and Conference gatherings, District Newsletters and Conference Grams, all other member nurturing activities and materials, AND our Conference Pledge made to our National Organization--the funds that fuel UMW missions around the world!

Pray, that our members can feel the necessity to give ALL within our means to help us meet our Pledge. Check stories in *response magazine* and the Prayer Calendar to know that without our giving, needs for the *least of these* will go unmet. When I go to bed dry, and warm and fed, I know there are those who do not without the help we give through United Methodist Women...we're in this together! Let's make a difference!

It has been an honor to serve as treasurer the past six years! I thank each of you for what you do to make the "gears turn" for United Methodist Women!
