Mission Study Hands On Mission Project - Hygiene Kits

1 hand towel, 1 washcloth, 1 sturdy comb with at least 6 inches of teeth, 1 pair of metal nail clippers, 1 bath-size bar soap, 1 adult toothbrush in original packaging and no advertising, 6 adhesive bandages, 1-gallon resealable plastic bag. No Ivory or Jergens soap and no emery boards or metal files.

Assembly Directions: Lay the hand towel flat on a table. Lay the washcloth flat in the center of the hand towel. Place all remaining items on top of the washcloth. Fold the sides of the hand towel to cover all the items. Fold one end of the hand towel so that it covers all the items. Starting at the unfolded end, grasp the bundle of items tightly and roll over the remainder of the hand towel tightly. Place the tightly rolled bundle in the plastic bag. Remove as much air as possible and seal the bag. Important - All items must be new, unwashed and without imprinted cartoon characters, advertisements, religious, patriotic, military or camouflage symbols.

Packing Instructions: Complete two packing lists, one for the box and one for your records. Place the shipping label/packing list on the outside of the box. Include in a separate envelope, a check for the total amount of hygiene kits times \$2 per kit for the cost of toothpaste and shipping
