Along with spring weather, a return to increased fellowship opportunities during this Easter season provides the uplifting renewal we need for healthier social and emotional living. It was a blessing to gather with United Women in Faith for the Mission Study on March 5. We hope more of you plan to join us for the Praise, Worship and Memorial Service on April 30, either in-person or live streamed.

As we put love into action to change the world, let us focus on the Alliance Center for Education (AC4Ed), formerly Bethlehem Center and one of five National Mission Institutions (NMI) in Western North Carolina, the only one located in our district. The twelve AC4Ed locations throughout the Charlotte community serve children birth to 5 years, maintain after school K-12 care, offer summer camp for students K-12, and attend to individual family needs through their outreach programs. Ways we can support women, children, and youth through AC4Ed include:

- Engaging in volunteer opportunities
- Providing diapers and wipes at district events and/or through our units at any time during the year (See Hands-on-Mission in program information for the Praise, Worship and Memorial Service)
- Designating specific fund-raising money for camper scholarships
- Donating school supplies
- Participating in Ubuntu Day and contributing Christmas Bags (hat, gloves/mittens, and an age-appropriate book) for one or more classrooms

United Women in Faith 2022 Launch

What an exciting time!! After 5 years of face-to-face conversations, surveys and focus groups the United Women in Faith has emerged. This new name follows over 25 titles since 1869. For the past 50 years, the United Methodist Women, the most recent designation, has had the honor of being the largest denominational faith organization for women with over 800,000 members around the world. We will continue to use this name legally and corporately while continuing to be the mandated woman's group as described in Section 13 of the United Methodist Book of Discipline.

United Women in Faith brings changes that address the different needs and life stages of current and new members as well as expanding options for membership and engagement. Additionally, it welcomes women whose current churches may disaffiliate with the United Methodist Church or are from other faith denominations.

Our new logo represents the past, present and future of our organization. The symbol refers to our Christian roots. The multicolored pieces of the cross coming together represent the diversity we aim for and the inward and outward reflection we engage in as women of faith. The typography is solid, modern, and bold, showcasing our power to support the causes to which we invest.

Begin this improved journey by exploring the new, easier to navigate website, <u>United Women in Faith | Love in Action</u> (<u>uwfaith.org</u>), and the developing new programs:

- A new, easier to navigate website with a homepage designed to pique new women's interest in United Women in Faith and a special portal set to come online later this year where members can log in to access additional resources. The appearance of the website is bold, colorful, uplifting and inspiring.
- A new 'All-Access' National Membership Option. The traditional structure of the conference, district, and local
 levels, including circles, will remain. All-Access allows existing and new members participation options: traditional,
 online, in-person, selected events.
- **Soul Care Retreats.** This pilot recruitment program, currently being rolled out, focuses on women's needs: mind, body, and spirit. This area represents one of great need in women's lives. We tend to take care of everyone else first leaving little time to address our needs.
- Innovations in the Leadership Development Day Programs. An annual event for conference officers and other United Women in Faith leaders, it is designed to equip and strengthen leaders with spirit-filled worship, officer training, leadership development workshops, networking and more.
- Innovations to Mission u. Going forward, programs will present a shared Biblical theme with three strands, one for children, one for youth and one for adults. This curricula coordination facilitates a united focus making it easier to use in whole churches, small groups, retreats, Vacation Bible Schools and other settings.

With the exciting changes accompanying the global launch of United Women in Faith, comes an opportunity for you to get involved in shaping the future of the organization through the Metro District Mission Team.



Historian

The organization that we know as United Methodist Women has been a constantly evolving organization since 1869, when eight women gathered to organize the **Woman's Foreign Missionary Society** in response to a lack of women's health and schooling for girls in India. Since then, it continued to grow to meet the needs of its members and the missions they serve.

In 1875, Lizzie Hoffman was instrumental in forming the Woman's Missionary Association of the United Brethren Church. In 1879, the Woman's Foreign Missionary Society of the Methodist Protestant Church was founded. In 1884, the Woman's Missionary Society was organized in the Evangelical Association. These groups became powerful, independent women's organizations sending missionaries all over the world and supporting many projects.

Woman's Home Missionary Societies were founded in 1880 (Methodist Episcopal Church) and 1890 (Methodist Episcopal Church, South). In the 1940s, **Ladies Aid Societies** were incorporated into missionary societies. These groups had existed for many years.

Through reorganization and denominational mergers, these various groups were brought together. In 1972/1973 the **United Methodist Women** became the women's mission organization of the United Methodist Church.

In 2012, the United Methodist Church General Conference voted to make the United Methodist Women's national policy making body autonomous.

Harriett Jane Olson, in her chief executive report at the organization's October 2013 Annual Meeting in New York City, reported: "Our work is not just about service, it's about worship, it's about standing up, stepping up to make our voices heard, she said. "We try to help governments see the world the way we see the world because it will positively impact the lives of women, children and youth." This statement is truer today as we transition to United Women in Faith.
