zation to better reflect the new opportunities for us and to share our new mission statement.

SOCIAL ACTION SPOTLIGHT ON:

Reducing Recidivism in Haywood County...How UMW can Help

In August, 2018 Haywood Pathways Center was awarded a grant to work in the Haywood County Detention Center to address the opioid epidemic. CJ Deering, a NC Certified Peer Support Specialist with over 40 years in recovery and a wide array of life experiences, was hired to head the program for women. CJ works to reduce the rate of recidivism (return visits to jail) by addressing the women's untreated substance use and mental health issues. She facilitates in-person groups focused on recovery and positive coping skills. They learn meditation, journaling and spirituality focus as a foundation for long term recovery. CJ also acts as a liaison between area treatment facilities and inmates, getting them the help needed to reduce recidivism.

The women in this program are between 18-40 years of age. Many have come from homes where there were illegal drugs, illegal activities and child abuse. About 80% of the women in the jail have children. These women want to strive for a better life, so they are willing to seek rehabilitation to address their substance use and mental health issues.

CJ said help can be provided in three ways; financial donations, time spent to help educate and befriend these women and providing needed goods. Financial donations go predominantly for books and materials for groups education on recovery, parenting and life skills. Recently, blankets and pillows were needed for women staying at the Swain Recovery Center. CJ was connected with Haywood Christian Ministries who provided the needed blankets and pillows. Helping Young People Helping Themselves

In Haywood County, and I suspect in your county too, there is an alternative high school for students that dropped out, were expelled or otherwise left high school before they earned their diploma. These alternative high schools allow students to re-enter high school and take classes at their own pace so they can earn their high school diploma.

Many of these students left high school to help earn money for their family needs, had been bullied in high school and could no longer take the pressure so left, some were expelled for various reasons. But all realized the need for completing their high school education. So they have taken it upon themselves to better their lives by earning their high school diploma and, in some cases, to go onto vocational school or college. The young people still believe in themselves and that is to be admired.

At the alternative high school in Haywood County, aka Haywood County Learning Center (HCLC), there are presently over 70 students attending virtual and in person classes. The students work at their own pace, often around their job schedule, family responsibilities or transportation to school. Because there is no cafeteria onsite, church members from local churches take lunch to the students. When those meals are not available, lunch is purchased from a local elementary school.

As District Social Action Coordinator, I would encourage your UMW to see if there is an alternative high school in your county that might benefit from your support. We are presently working with students teaching them how to garden and can or freeze food. We help with the cost

of renting caps and gowns at graduation. We lead them to resources like free clothing. I think you will find it rewarding helping young people helping themselves.


