Frequently Asked Questions on United Women in Faith

Are we still a part of The United Methodist Church?

Yes! We are still the only official women's organization of The United Methodist Church, and our legal name will remain United Methodist Women.

What do we call ourselves now?

You are United Women in Faith! It's okay to ease into it; it's a big change, We'll have the new logo ready for download on our new website, and other materials are available there to help us all and transition together.

How were these decisions made?

Our new programs are fruits of the research the national office conducted over the past quadrennium along with prayerfully seeking to discern the times for our organization. The memberelected United Methodist Women board of directors, with input from the program advisory group, has guided the organization throughout this process.

We've conducted surveys, focus groups and interviews with more than 24,000 United Methodists and women of other denominations and Christian traditions. The changes and programs are data-informed and tested to address the needs and life stages of current members and new women.

Will these changes impact me and my local unit?

All of our traditional structures on the conference, district and local levels citcles included—remain intact. These new tools and programs are additional options available to you and your unit to help you better nurture current members, recruit new women into the organization and manage your unit's finances.

Can we be members if our church leaves The United Methodist Church?

Yes. Changes to the bylaws allow for women to be involved and be leaders in our organization even if they become affiliated with another denomination. Our new name makes our organization more inclusive.

Where can I learn about all of the changes underway?

New Wineskins resources available on the website at uwfaith.org will give you an overview of the changes underway. Changes include the new name, new website, templates for Soul Care retreats, innovations to Mission u and Leadership Development Days, a national membership option, more targeted giving options, new online tools for treasurers and new and improved resources.

What is the New Wineskins Campaign?

United Methodist Women—now United Women in Faith—is again saying yes to being part of what God is doing in the 21st century by creating new and improved ways for women today to gather for faith, sisterhood and action for women, children and youth.

In other words, we are making new wine and new wineskins to fulfill our role in God's mission today. The New Wineskins Campaign is about these exciting changes and spreading this great news with members during this time of transition.

Why the rebranding?

Brand is a term most often associated today with commercial marketing, but in reality, everyone has a brand. Brand is just a term to describe what people can expect to experience when they encounter you. Branding encompasses the things we do—our look, our actions, our messages—that help let people know who we are and what we deliver.

Rebranding United Methodist Women means we are refreshing the way we tell our story and updating our programs, resources and ourreach efforts so that we better nurture current members and are more attractive to and welcoming of women of diverse backgrounds and life stages by meeting them where they are.

Greetings: UMW – United Women in Faith Sisters!

As we hear less about Covid 19 and Omicron, I hope that all of us are once again having *in person* meetings and beginning to be able to *carry on* as we once did!

However, if you read the March/April issue of **response** magazine you know there are changes of our going forth! If you have not read the issue, I will share some information from "**response - the magazine of women in mission**". In Tara Barnes "thank" article, she tells us we have been "United Methodist Women" since 1972, after the Evangelical United Brethren Church merged with the Methodist Church to become the United Methodist Church and the Women's Society of Christian Service and Wesleyan Service Guild became one organization. In the **response** article "We are United Women in Faith!", by Yvette Moore, states "in 150 years in mission, our organization has had more than 25 names, each reflecting the varying times, ways women lived their lives and the states of union or our many predecessor denominations". We United Women in Faith just adds to the number of names we've been!

Our Conference Treasurer, Nancy Reigel, has a lot of information and answers to some of the many questions we may have in the latest "Conference Gram". Sharing some of her "news", you should know that the National Treasurer says: "Checks to local, districts and conferences should continue to be payable to United Methodist Women so that your checks can be deposited at your banking institutions". For Yadkin Valley, this means you still make checks payable to "YV UMW"!

There are "new ways for giving, new giving options." Our traditional ways of giving remain ABSOLUTELY the SAME and continue to be vital and critical channels of support for our Missions. We still have all our traditional five channels of undesignated giving and all other designated giving options as before! Our options for giving have <u>expanded</u>, not reduced or closed. The new and old will go forward hand in hand, supporting Mission as we have done all along. We are keeping what is good and adding more.

Our Local, District and Conference Treasurers will CONTINUE to follow the quarterly Remittance process with **NO** changes required. That means the current forms and giving options continue to function. We continue to urge members and units to give in all five channels of Undesignated giving. We continue to urge our members and units to support our National Mission Institutions and International mission projects as Designated Mission Giving through their quarterly remittances.

And now in 2022 we are "declaring our bold future as **United Women in Faith**, connecting and nurturing women through spiritual formation, leadership development, creative fellowship and education so that we can inspire, influence and impact local and global communities". Is not that what we've been doing since 1869? Only the name has changed!

"Without change there would be no butterfly", change can be beautiful! Let our light shine as we approach the days ahead that others may see us for what we are: <u>United Women in Faith</u>!

From Camille French, District Social Action Chair

United Women in Faith – Advocacy Initiatives for April – Social Justice

We continue our focus this month on the national initiative to end the school to Prison Pipeline and to end pushout in schools for our girls of color. As Christians, advocacy should be at the heart of what we do and how we use our talents to secure justice for others. This was Christ's example for us: to advocate for those who cannot advocate for themselves.

There are two ways that we are asking you to advocate immediately. One is to help us end the School to Prison Pipeline. By supporting the Counseling not Criminalization in Schools Act, you will help to advocate providing resources to shift the course correction from punishment to funding for additional resources like counseling for students. You can advocate that your representatives support this bill by using the link below. There are several races in this year's elections that also speak to these issues. We an also ensure that we vote in persons who will align with these initiatives.

The other way to advocate is to help end pushout and criminalization of girls of color in our schools. The book <u>Pushout</u> continues to be on our reading list and describes how girls of color are discriminated against and treated unfairly in schools. Our district also had a mission study on this very issue last year, highlighting its importance in our faith journey. Join United Women in Faith by contacting your representative and asking them to support the Ending PUSHOUT Act. In addition, pay attention to the upcoming primary and general elections here in Forsyth County and surrounding areas. In Forsyth County in particular, we have heavily contested school board races. Take the time to engage those candidates and see how they plan to support this bill and advocate for equality in our schools.

The Hands-On Mission Project was non-perishable foods and sanitary supplies for girls to be donated to the Open Arms Community of the United Methodist Church in Winston-Salem, NC. The items collected filled the bed and back seat of Dwight Smith's truck. We extend our thanks to Dwight for loading and transporting the food and sanitary items to the Open Arms Community.
