Come to the Water





Did you know?

Water makes up about 71% of the Earth's surface; continents and islands make up the remaining 29%.

Oceans contain about 96.5% of all Earth's water. Therefore, only 3.5% is freshwater – water that we can use to live.

Water takes many forms: air vapor, rivers, lakes, icecaps, glaciers, in moisture within the soil, and in aquifers.

There is the same amount of water on Earth now as when the Earth was created.

Water regulates the Earth's temperature.

A person can survive only about 3 days without access to water.

A newborn baby is 78% water, while an adult is 55 -60% water. Water is involved in just about everything our body does. It's a big part of the blood that brings nutrients to all our cells. We use it to get rid of wastes. It helps us regulate our body temperature. It acts as a shock absorber for our brain and spinal cord. We are very dependent on water.

Water is mentioned a total of 722 times in *The Bible*, more often than faith, hope, prayer, and worship.

Water begins *The Bible*, in Genesis, Chapters 1-2 and ends the Bible, in Revelation, Chapter 22, verse 17. Water flows through scripture, showing us how important it is to us both physically and spiritually.
