

Historian

"Hidden Figures: The American Dream and the Untold Story of Black Women Mathematicians Who Helped Win the Space Race." By Margot Lee Shetterly

(Reading Program Category: Leadership Development, 2022)

Christine Mann, an Allen High School¹ student, 1956-58 was one of the 'second generation' of Black women ("hidden figures") whose mathematical skills were the heart of the successful development of the space program at Langley Field, VA. Collectively the women were referred to as the "Black computers."

- Christine's Parents: Noah (Life Insurance agent) and Desma (homemaker and teacher)
- The family moved to the Newtown neighborhood of Monroe, NC, in 1943 when Christine was a child. She frequently accompanied her mother to school and at age 5 was enrolled in second grade.
- She attended Winchester Avenue High School for two years before moving to Asheville (1956) where she attended Allen High School and worked in the library. She graduated in May 1958 as Valedictorian.
- Christine was accepted for college at Hampton Institute, Langley, VA.

"Hidden Figures" author describes Allen: "The Allen School was founded in 1887 by white United Methodist missionaries,² with the goal of providing talented Negro girls from Appalachia NC with the best possible start in life...... All the girls had "duty work assignments" like Christine's Library post.....Despite economic circumstances of the student body Allen was considered one of the best Negro high schools in the country.The charismatic 11th grade geometry teacher³ stoked her interest in math, her knack for numbers and all things analytical."

The extensively documented text is informative and exciting!

¹ In 1958 Allen High School, a residential school, enrolled 140 students, grades 7-12, with 21 faculty and staff. Christine lived in the Muriel Day Residence Hall built with funds from the Call to Prayer and Self-Denial offering. It is still in use today as a commercial office building. Among the faculty who later became Brooks-Howell Home residents were: Ruth Walther, Bettie Sue Smith, Julia Titus and Winifred Wrisley.

² Allen High School was established by the Woman's Home Missionary Society of the Methodist Episcopal Church.
