

Housing is available at Lake Junaluska by phone reservation only at the Terrace, Lambuth Inn or the Apartments. All housing information can be found on the Conference website.

The keynote speaker is Tamara Clark, Treasurer and CFO of United Women in Faith. Her topics will include "Rest for My Soul" and "Faith and Deeds." Tamara will also facilitate an afternoon workshop session entitled "Flexibility in the Midst of Change."
