MEMBERSHIP, NURTURE & OUTREACH:

Sometimes I feel like we have become too serious in our sisterhood of "United Women in Faith." We often spend too much time "taking care of business," and not enough time taking care of THE BUSINESS OF CARING FOR EACH OTHER, of getting to know each other, of sincerely valuing each other as sisters.

I will share with you a story: A few years ago I was invited to participate in a Bible Study with women from various denominational backgrounds, namely Baptist, Methodist, Catholic, Presbyterian, and Anglican faiths. Most of these women had been in the study group for a long time. They had studied the Bible, chapter by chapter all the way from Genesis to Malachi.

I joined the group at the beginning of the study of Matthew. We meet weekly for at least two hours in each other's homes. We painstakingly study the Bible, verse by verse. We don't always agree. We laugh. We cry. We share our stories. We listen to each other. We pray! I confess, I am not a very patient person and those two hour sessions were just too much for me at first. But along came COVID-19, and we did not meet for a long time. During that time I was given the opportunity to reevaluate the importance of that group of women in my life and I came to realize the time spent with them was of such value to me that I would take the time to enjoy all the blessings they could offer.

What does this have to do with our local UWF (UMW) Units? Everything! Maybe we can find a different way to conduct our business (for it is important) and more time learning about missions, near and far. Maybe we can simply practice the art of sisterhood, of being together.

United Women in Faith: In Mission with Ukraine

Our still-new national website (<u>uwfaith.org</u>) states, "We serve. We advocate. We make a difference." Even as we were transforming to United Women in Faith, we were still responding to needs in Ukraine. We are agile; we are flexible; we are informed. As our national website says, "Education can transformed."

form women. Educated women can transform the world." UWF members are well-educated in the needs of women, children, and youth. As transformed women, we strive to transform the world.

In April, the UWF podcast "<u>Faith Talks</u>" was Women in Peacemaking. Topics include the impact of war in Ukraine on marginalized groups and peace efforts by women of faith. This podcast is available at <u>uwfaith.org/resources/podcasts</u>.

In March, UWF announced its first emergency grant of \$10,000 to a women's center in Kyiv. The center supports women who are implementing the United Nations Resolution on Women, Peace, and Security. The resolution promotes leadership in the areas of peace, security, and humanitarian aid.

This emergency grant is possible only because of your faithful giving. It is possible only because most of our mission giving is undesignated. Just three weeks after Russia invaded Ukraine, UWF announced the emergency grant. They didn't have to wait to make an emergency appeal for funds. The money was there because UWF members understand designated dollars have limited use. We understand money can better meet urgent needs when we don't restrict its use.

Money is understandably and appropriately pouring into Ukraine. But we know Ukraine is not the only place with desperate needs. UWF can meet needs in 34 countries and all 50 states because we support undesignated giving.

The July/August issue of <u>response</u> magazine includes an article about our efforts in Ukraine (United Women in Faith International Ministries). Our mission magazine is available in print and online. Check it out!
