UMCOR Introduces "Period Packs"

Are tampons the first thing you would grab if you had minutes to flee your home? Probably not! People displaced by fire, flood, and other natural disasters often have only minutes to grab some belongings. We can provide health and dignity products to temporarily displaced people by assembling menstrual hygiene kits.

UMCOR Menstrual Hygiene Kit items (kit value \$14, \$2 per kit shipping)

- One one-gallon size resealable bag
- Two 2-oz bottles of hand sanitizer
- Three 4-gallon bathroom trash bags
- One travel pack of hand wipes such as "Wet Ones."
- 10 Tampons (5 regular and 5 super absorbency), unscented
- Bath-size soap (3 oz. bar or larger). No lvory or Jergens soap. Do not remove soap from packaging.
- One 42-count pack of flushable wipes, <u>unscented</u>.
- One "travel sink" laundry detergent packet (.25-.45 oz)

To assemble: Place one pack of the flushable wipes and wet wipes in the one-gallon resealable bag. Place four bathroom trash bags and 10 sanitary napkins in the bag. Add smaller items in the plastic bag, remove air, and seal.

(A donation of \$2 per kit for shipping is suggested. Please do not put check inside kit.)

•	Connect with local and district groups. Start a book club, download books onto an e-reader to pass around and share, present book reviews at group meetings.
•	Display a progress chart in your church for all who wish to participate, and post displays to encourage book sales.
	Pray. Books often raise concerns about people, countries, and issues. Bring these concerns to God during your prayer time at home and at group meetings.
•	Advocate for tangible change. Many Reading Program books address issues including climate change, mass incarceration and racism. Organize a task force to address these issues in your community.
