#### **Social Action**

The disciplinary policies and practices that create an environment for the US school-to-prison pipeline to occur disproportionately affect disabled, Latino, and Black students, which is later re-flected in the rates of incarceration. Between 1999 and 2007, the percentage of Black students being suspended has increased by 12 percent, while the percentage of white students being suspended has declined since the implementation of zero-tolerance policies. Of the total incarcerated population in the US, 61 percent are Black or Latino.

**From Statesville:** Take I-40 W toward Hickory. Take exit 130 toward Old US 70. Turn right onto 1st St W. Turn right onto Section House Rd. Turn right onto Springs Rd NE. Turn left onto Kool Park Rd NE. Continue on Cloninger Mill Rd NE. Turn right onto N Center St (NC-127). Continue on NC Highway 127 (NC-127). Church is on the left. **Or** take Exit 148 Hwy 64/90 W to Taylorsville, follow directions from there.

**From Taylorsville:** Take US Highway 64 90 W (US-64). Turn left onto NC Highway 127 (NC-127). Go for 8.6 mi. Church is on right.

**From Boone:** Travel to Wilkesboro via 421 or Lenoir via 321 and follow directions from that point. **From Wilkesboro:** Turn onto NC Highway 16 S (NC-18). Go for 16.9 mi. Turn right onto W Main Ave (NC-90). Turn right onto US Highway 64 90 W (US-64). Turn left onto NC Highway 127 (NC-127). Go 8.6 mi. Church rt.

**From Lenoir**: Turn right onto Taylorsville Rd (US-64) toward Taylorsville. Take 2nd exit from roundabout onto Taylorsville Rd (US-64). Turn right onto NC Highway 127 (NC-127). Go 8.6 mi. Church rt.

**From Sparta**: Take NC Highway 18 S. Continue on S NC Highway 16 (NC-18) for 16.9 mi. Right onto W Main Ave (NC-90). Right onto US Highway 64 90 W (US-64). Left onto NC 127 (NC-127). Go for 8.6 mi. Church rt. **From Elkin**: Take I-77 S toward US-21-BYP S. Take exit 51B toward Asheville onto I-40 W. Take exit 148 Hwy 64/90 W to Taylorsville, follow directions from there.

From Hudson/Granite Falls: Take Hickory Blvd (US-321). Turn left onto 2nd Ave NW. Turn left onto 2nd St NE (NC-127). Go for 5.3 mi. Continue on NC Highway 127 (NC-127). Go for 1.4 mi. Church on left. From Union Grove: Wilkesboro Hwy (NC-115). Turn right onto Damascus Church Rd. Continue on Sharpe Mill Rd. Turn left onto Sulphur Springs Rd. Turn right onto NC Highway 90 E (NC-90). For Outreach, Help to make your meetings special by inviting a local guest or friends from other units. Reach out to someone to let them know that we are all Women in Faith.



#### Greetings to all!

In Philippians 4:4 (NIV), the apostle Paul declares that we "Rejoice in the Lord, always. I will say it again: Rejoice! The Appalachian District UWF was able to send in to the Conference \$30,540.73 of Undesignated gifts - Pledge to Mission, which includes Pledge to Mission, Special Mission Recognition, Gift to Mission, Gift in Memory, and World Thank Offering. We did come up short of our Pledge to Mission of \$40,000 for 2022, but we can rejoice in the number of women, children and youth we were able to make a difference in their lives through our mission giving. \$3,681 was given as Designated Gifts and \$1,123.01 to the Legacy Fund.

No matter what our United Women in Faith (UWF) units went through last year, a good way to start our mission giving for 2023 is by embracing the word rejoice. In every moment of this new year, we can give thanks to the Lord for His love and provision and rejoice in the hope we have in Jesus who "make(s) all things new" (Revelation 21:5, NKJV).

It was so GREAT to meet in-person for our District meetings last year and I am looking forward to seeing ALL members at the Prayer Breakfast in March and the Mission Study in April. #### Wilkesboro UMC Sewing Bee

At Wilkesboro UMC, Tanya Shire (our Project Coordinator) runs a Sewing Bee, in which many (over half) of our United Women in Faith participate. The first sewing bee met in October, 2014, in our

church fellowship hall (of course, everyone had to bring their own sewing machine, ironing board & iron and sewing materials & tools). We started with "pillowcase" dresses for girls and donated caps for boys (a goal of 100 each for the 1<sup>st</sup> year) to send with mission teams. In December, 2014, we added making boy's shorts. It became cumbersome & time -consuming to set up at church, so in August 2015, Tanya and her husband Aaron did some circuit capacity adjustments and set up 8 sewing machines and 5 ironing stations plus a large cutting table in their basement (later added shelves to hold material and 2 serge machines); as many as 26 people have been able to productively work in this space at one time! In December, 2017, we made 100 book bags for UMW (App District) and have since added book bags to our distributions; then in March 2019, we started making LuoPads and in October 2021, started making back packs! In 2022, we distributed 1716 dresses, 1711 pairs of shorts, 2404 bookbags, 958 backbacks, and 6435 Luopads. Distribution this year was to Ghana (3 locations), Togo, Guatemala, Armenia, Guyana, Kenya, Navajo Indian Reservation, Montana Indian Reservation, Rise Against Hunger (distributes meals in 22 countries.) Past destinations also included Costa Rica, Honduras, Dominican Republic, Haiti, Puerto Rico, Romania, Ukraine, Swaziland, NC coast, West Virginia mountains and First Baptist in Lenoir for homeless program. We operate as a 501c(3) organization through Wilkesboro UMC; we do not have a budget, but operate with volunteers and donations we can always use material (including heavy fabric for bookbags & backpacks) pillowcases, thread, trim, and cash donations (it's expensive to ship barrels and boxes!) If you would like to volunteer, we meet the first Saturday of each month from 8:30 am - noon and we need people to sew and serge, cutters, ironers, packers; if you know of any mission destinations and contacts, we would love to expand our distributions – we do not charge for these items; we only request that someone try to hand deliver the products to avoid black market problems and send us pictures of the "smiling faces" with distribution!
