#### 1/29/23 Treasurer's Report

2022 was another challenging year due to the ongoing pandemic and the issues we are dealing with in the Methodist Church. We made 78% of our Pledge to Mission, which had been set in July 2021. We gave \$46,857.46 out of our \$50,000.00 pledge. We only used \$3,655.24 of our \$5,550.00 A&MD Budget.

Our 2023 Pledge to Missions changed to \$40,000, and our A&MD Budget changed to \$4,875.00. Hopefully, we'll be able to have more in-person events this year so we can further develop our members and grow our mission giving to achieve our Pledge.

Total 2022 Mission giving to the Western North Carolina Conference was \$52,611.62 and Legacy Fund money sent to the National Office was \$1,284.02.

Treasurers, if you have not sent me your Unit's list of recipients of pins and GTM/GIM cards for 2022 and/or your 2023 pledge form with your contact information, please do so as soon as possible. If you need any forms, please let me know. First quarter remittances are due to me by February 28<sup>th</sup>. You will be receiving a letter from me around the first week in February about what to include in this remittance. If you need anything or have any questions, please feel free to call, text or email me.

Many Units try to achieve giving in all five channels of undesignated mission giving. Just a \$5.00 donation in category meets this requirement. The five channels of giving, which also count towards your Unit's Pledge are:

- Pledge to Mission
- Special Mission Recognition
- Gift to Mission
- Gift in Memory
- World Thank Offering
- And Walk to Mission is a bonus category that counts toward you Pledge too!

If your unit is still not meeting in person, you can give on-line on the WNCC UMW website. Click on the "GIVE NOW" link at the top line on the Home Page or use <u>https://wnccumw.org/online-mission-giving/</u>. These on-line gifts WILL be credited back to your Unit. Or, anyone can send a check directly to me towards their Unit's giving. Just note your Unit on your check. (Of course, if your unit is meeting, you can still give through the normal quarterly remittance process.)

As a 1<sup>st</sup> year treasurer, I look forward to hopefully seeing many of you in-person this year at District and Conference events. Until then, let's still do what we can to help women, youth and children locally and around the world. #### <u>Historian</u>

In 1869, Clementina Butler and Lois Parker, wives of missionaries to India, made a plea to a group of eight women in Boston about the spiritual and physical needs of poor women in India.

They could not be treated by male doctors. Schooling for girls was almost non-existent. Help was desperately needed. In what would become a lasting legacy of "showing up and getting things

- done," the attendees were moved to action. They quickly called another meeting of more women. They wrote a constitution. And in short order, they organized the Methodist Woman's Foreign
- Missionary Society (WFMS). By November 1869, the newly formed organization raised funds and sent educator Isabella Thoburn and Dr. Clara Swain to India.
- Ms. Thoburn began a school with just six young girls that went on to become Isabella Thoburn College, Asia's first women's college. Dr. Swain's medical work resulted in the first women's
- hospital in Asia. Both institutions continue to serve the people of India today. During this same era, when so many women were held down by prejudice and circumstance,
- other fearless females across the country were moved to answer the call to stand up for better lives for women and a better world for all.
- The Woman's Missionary Association of the United Brethren Church was formed in 1875. Two strong Woman's Home Missionary Societies were founded in 1880 and 1890.
- The Woman's Foreign Missionary Society of the Methodist Protestant Church was formed in 1879 and then the Woman's Missionary Society in the Evangelical Association in 1884.
  - These groups became powerful, independent women's organizations, sending hundreds of women missionary doctors, nurses, and educators all over the world and supporting countless.
  - U.S. and international projects. And advocating for justice, children, women and disenfranchised. communities joined together by a common faith and single-minded purpose.
- Then the Ladies' Aid societies were started in the early 1900s. In 1972, United Methodist Women first became the women's mission organization as part of The
- United Methodist Church's Board of Global Ministries. And in 2012, The United Methodist Church General Conference voted to make United Methodist Women's national policymaking.
  - Today, we mark the beginning of a new era. As United Women in Faith, we stand ready to not only continue our legacy but forge courageous new paths. We will go wherever we are
- needed, without hesitation, because the needs are great but our power was strong. As we begin this new era, we will be beginning a new Historical Notebook for United
  - Women of Faith for the Uwharrie District. Please if you have any pictures of any Local, District or Conference Event please send them to me so that they can go in this notebook.

#### What is the Legacy Fund?

- A key element of the 150th Anniversary celebration in 2019.
- A designated fund (endowment) of the national office of United Methodist Women. (Only interest can be expended.)

#### What is the Purpose of the Legacy Fund?

- 1. To assure the continuation of ministries with women, children, and youth, worldwide, into the next 150 years.
- 2. To enable United Methodist Women to respond more adequately to new and emerging needs.
- To minimize the risk of severe budget fluctuation in years of recession, regional. financial crisis or change in giving by the membership.

#### How will the funds be used?

The total program of United Methodist Women is mission. Interest from The Legacy Fund will be added to Mission Giving funds to formulate the national budget of United Methodist Women. (Mission Giving is the largest source of that budget which includes grants to National Mission Institutions such as the Bethlehem Centers in Charlotte and Winston-Salem, international programs and projects, program resource production, training, and more.)
