



Skyland UWF Put Love into Action

Grace Circle United Women in Faith, Skyland, and the Skyland Unit held their first Climate Justice Social Action Event on February 4, 2023. On behalf of Grace Circle members, Circle Chair Betty L. Thompson asked Asheville Mayor Esther Manheimer to sign a proclamation naming Saturday, February 4, Rosa Parks Transit Equity Day in celebration of Rosa Parks' birthday.

Member Jan Whiteman and Skyland Unit President Kathy Woods

attended the Asheville City Council meeting where Mayor Manheimer's proclamation was read and presented to the Council. In the proclamation, the mayor urged "the city of Asheville to remember and celebrate the work of Rosa Parks and be inspired to find ways and means to create better conditions for all people to live in our community, country, and world" by securing ways for all persons to have equal access to public transit.

Through this local action, Grace Circle joined other United Women in Faith across the country, civic and labor organizations, and cities in observing <u>Transit Equity Day</u>. The circle tapped into resources provided by Kisha Nicolas, <u>Just Energy 4 All</u> Coordination Consultant with the national United Women in Faith's Office of Economic and Environmental Justice. The circle also provided an educational display at Givens Gerber Park, where Grace Circle members live, so that residents, visitors, and staff could learn about this national day of action that commemorates Rosa Parks' birthday and declares that public transit is a civil right. This is love taking ACTION!

ENJOYMENT AND ENRICHMENT: THE GIFTS OF OUR UWF READING PROGRAM

When you are getting ready to embark on a muchanticipated trip, what do you do to prepare yourself to enjoy the trip to its fullest? Yes, you plan your wardrobe and pack your bags; many of us also spend a considerable amount of time reading about the places we're going. Lush photographs and vivid descriptions of accommodations, restaurants, and tourist attractions whet our wanderer's appetite for what lies ahead. Perhaps we read nonfiction books about the places and cultures we will experience or novels set in our travel destination. For many of us, this becomes not just preface but prologue to our journey, making the experience all the richer before we even leave home. We depart with a deeper interest in and understanding of what we will see and do, a greater connection with the people and places we will encounter.

The same can be true of our journey with United Women in Faith. One of our best and most enjoyable resources for this journey is our <u>UWF Reading Program</u>. The Reading Program can be far more than an "oh by the way" perk of UWF; it can deepen our *faith*, give richer meaning to our *action*, and enliven our precious times among this *sisterhood*.

As you engage with <u>this year's reading list</u>, open your mind and heart to experience all that our authors have offered us. Stop and wonder, lingering with perspectives and experiences outside your usual go-to list. Read the books that seem right up your alley and perhaps one or two that are beyond your comfort zone. If you usually lean toward social action titles, you might give spiritual growth a try for a change of pace. Add a young adult novel to your list and see what you make of it. Expand your reading experience by reading with others: family members, friends, or colleagues. Share some selections with your children, grandchildren, or great-grandchildren. Read with your ears using audiobooks while out on your walk. May the Reading Program nourish your soul, add enjoyment to your life, and enrich your journey.

For two years I declined a friend's invitation, but I knew she would never stop asking. My thoughts were screaming, "NO, I DO NOT WANT TO GO TO THE SCHOOL OF CHRISTIAN MISSION!" I mean, really? I didn't know anyone, and why would I want to go to school in the hottest part of summer: sleep in a hot dorm room, sit for hours in a hot classroom, and eat school cafeteria food? That was NOT what I considered fun. I had no desire to go on a mission trip so I considered the School of Christian Mission to be irrelevant to my life. Mostly so I could get off the hook the next year with the standard "Been there, done that; not doing it again," I finally relented and said, "Okay." I haven't missed a year since!

My first School of Christian Mission experience was at Greensboro College. The following year, Mission u as we now call it returned to Pfeiffer University where it originally began.  Pfeiffer University adjusts the indoor temperature to accommodate even the most hot-blooded among us.
 And for those of you who, like me, suffer from bad knees, feet, backs, hips or whatever ailment, there are golf carts to take you from one location to another.

- Cafeteria food? My college never offered a pizza bar and soft serve ice cream! From meat and three to pizza, deli, salads, and desserts, Pfeiffer offers it all. If you have dietary restrictions they will accommodate with advance notice.
- Not going on a mission? Guess again! Every day of your life can be a mission; we must educate ourselves on how to combat injustices, help solve everyday community problems, and work together to participate in the global ministries of the church. Additionally, in the small group setting you have an opportunity to learn how a church of any size, from small to large, can be effective in mission; a veritable plethora of ideas abounds. As I have been reminded, we will never change the world to the way we want it, but we can pray and ask God how we can help to change it to the way God wants it!

As we thankfully return to an in-person Mission u this summer, I am begging, pleading, beseeching you: Please, please register and attend Mission u 2023, whether for a one-day overview or a weekend getaway. The price is reasonable and the in-person experience is absolutely PRICELESS!!!






