



## Our Spiritual Growth Retreat Leaders



We are excited to announce that **Rev. Jan Brittain** will be our **retreat leader** for the 2023 Spiritual Growth Retreat. Jan retired in 2022 after serving almost 11 years as the senior pastor at Williamson's Chapel UMC in Mooresville in the Metro District. Prior to that she served for 8 years as the senior pastor at Christ UMC in Greensboro in the Northern Piedmont District.

#### More about Jan...

Kneeling on the concrete floor of a summer camp in the mountains of NC, Jan Brittain committed her life to full time Christian service at the age of 16. Of course, at that time, she did not know any women pastors and assumed her commitment would take her overseas as a missionary. But God had other plans. Jan has served churches of all sizes and in a variety of locations — country, urban, suburban, mountain, farm, and finally a regional church at Lake Norman.

And though, not in the way she anticipated, Jan has done her share of overseas work. She began her ministry by serving churches in Bristol, England and has worked with churches and ministries in Guatemala, Bolivia, Kenya, Uganda, Jamaica and Haiti. Jan has preached on 4 continents and in some notable settings including the New Room (the oldest Methodist Church in the world), at the 200th anniversary of the oldest Methodist Church in Bolivia, in the Duke Chapel and in Stuart Auditorium at Lake Junaluska.

Jan's background in Christian Education and her degree in Business Administration, along with her nearly 4 decades of professional ministry are resources that are still serving the local church and the larger church. Her focus is on preaching and teaching in a variety of settings and facilitating the success of other clergy. Jan writes a devotional blog — graceinbitsandpieces.wordpress.com. Jan is a true child of the church. As the daughter of a United Methodist pastor, Jan grew up in the parsonages of South Carolina. And, at the top of any list of achievements or blessings, Jan would put the honor of being a mother and a Gran Jan.

Jan summarizes her personal theology this way:

- 1. God's motivation is always love.
- 2. Jesus Christ's death on the cross is the means to our salvation. His resurrection is the promise of our eternity. We cannot save ourselves and, praise God, we do not have to.
- 3. There are three absolute essentials for effective and faithful living: time spent in God's word, time spent in prayer and time spent with God's people.
- 4. God formed and chose the Church. As flawed as the Church is, it is still God's chosen agent for doing His work in the world. Those who want to be on God's team find their place in the Church and go to work helping the Church do what only the Body of Christ can do.

#### Music Leaders

**Rev. Dr. Mark L. Barden** is no stranger to the United Women in Faith. While serving on the Western NC Conference Staff (2000-2011), he was the staff liaison to the conference United Methodist Women. Through the years, he has participated in many UWF/UMW events including leading music at district and conference gatherings.

Mark is the son of a WNCC United Methodist pastor and grandson of United Methodist missionaries who served in Africa. He began his career teaching journalism and broadcasting at the University of Mississippi and Murray State University (KY). Following his call to ordained ministry, he completed seminary at Duke University, later earning a doctorate in Arts and Theology from Wesley Theological Seminary in Washington, DC. He has served churches throughout our conference in addition to serving on conference staff. He is currently pastor of First UMC, Norwood and plans to retire this month.

For 25 years, he has collaborated with Catherine Ritch on a variety of ventures. From leading music and performing concerts to photographing and

designing covers for Catherine's books, they have traveled all over the world gathering stories of God's love at work through the church and its missions. He is married to the Rev. Barbara Barden, retired clergy from Myers Park UMC, Charlotte. They have a son, Chris, a computer software developer, who lives in Charlotte.





Catherine Ritch, a native of Matthews, NC, is a published composer and author of inspirational fiction, non-fiction and children's books with 27 books currently in print, and 7 others currently in process. A frequent speaker/musician in a variety of venues, she has entertained or spoken for audiences around the globe. She was selected as the International Profile of The United Methodist Church for September 2009 because of her continual work and efforts with missions for schools in areas of natural disasters.

Catherine's lightening quick wit and musical talent are astonishing enough, but combined with her never ending source of positive energy, the woman is a ball of fire that's sure to inspire." Put Catherine on a piano, organ or keyboard and from Bach to Broadway to Boogie to the Best of Gospel, she'll have the audience enthralled with the rhythms of life.

One of Catherine's most fun ventures is a comedy series featuring Miz Eudora Rumph of Smackass Gap, NC, which happens to be a real place (where Methodists have The Hinton Retreat Center). Dressed as Miz Eudora, she has entertained doctors and medical personnel, ministers and bishops, teachers and various other groups with "Laughter Is the Best Medicine" through the simple mountain wit and wisdom of her Appalachian grandmother. In Catherine's words, "People in today's society take themselves way too seriously or get caught up in unnecessary stresses. A good dose of Miz Eudora is a cure for all that ails you, and also for that which don't!"

Catherine has been introduced as an author, composer, comedienne, entertainer, teacher, musician, inspirational/motivational speaker, and volunteer-in-mission, but her favorite way to be acknowledged is "friend.
