

### President's Message





Well as fall is approaching, we have experienced two wonderful United Women in Faith (UWF) events. Both annual celebrations presented the accomplishments of this past year (2022) and looked forward to the coming year 2024. There was the installation of officers and new events with new budgets, new speakers, music, & mission activities. One of these events was on the District level (August 19<sup>th</sup>) at Bethlehem UMC, Waxhaw and the other on the Conference level this past weekend (September 8th-10th) at Lake Junaluska.

We had 55 at Bethlehem UMC & they were wonderful hosts with special gifts & refreshments. Catherine Ritch was the speaker and dressed as Suzanna Wesley. She described Suzanna's mosaic of faith throughout her life. Cindy Carter led a skit, with the youth of Bethlehem and some UWF members, describing the life of John Wesley. Both did an excellent job describing the mosaic of faith as illustrated in the lives of Suzanna, John's mother, and John in his ministry throughout the world.

Rev. Holly McKim was the speaker for the Conference event and did a wonderful job with the following topics: "The Mosaic of Your Life" & "Holding the Bits & Pieces Together". Uwharrie District presented our mosaic art display of tiles in the new emblem design of the United Women in Faith. This artwork was dedicated in honor of Vickie Brown since she was unable to be present, but she found & purchased the supplies and stenciled the emblem. Another group of Uwharrie District members glued the tiles to the

plexiglass. Women were asked at the District Annual Celebration to write how they became involved in UMW or UWF and what it has meant to them. Twenty-five cards were turned in and organized into a booklet by Carla Carrick. These 4 booklets were placed on display with the mosaic artwork at the conference annual celebration.

Be on the lookout for this mosaic display at all the future Uwharrie District events.

It will be a combination of giving local officers information and tools to take back with them to use at the local level; as well as a time for sharing & networking. ### \$\$\$ Notes from the Treasurer

Our Q3 remittance was sent to Conference in early September. Year-to-date, we have paid \$22,942.44 against our Pledge to Mission so far, which is 57%. This is behind where we were hoping to be by this point, but we will count our blessings. Year-to-date Mission giving paid to Western North Carolina Conference (WNCC), including designated gifts is \$28,404.14. We have also paid \$100.00 to National for Legacy Fund.

On a high note, we have collected \$3,315.00 from Mission Walks already so far! Thank you, Uwharrie District, on behalf of all the women, youth and children you are helping!

#### Climate Change at the GOP Debate

Young conservatives have a concern over climate change. Young voters across all party lines feel it is a top issue. Sixty percent of voters 18 to 29 believe it is a priority. Sixty four percent believe that climate change is a major threat. Seventy two percent feel climate change is affecting their community. This question was presented to the candidates by Alexander Diaz. The question was, "How will you as both President and leader of the Republican Party calm their fears that the Republican Party doesn't care about climate change?" The candidates would not give a direct answer except for Vivek Ramaswany who stated that climate change is a hoax despite the overwhelming scientific consensus that climate change is due to human activities associated with the burning of fossil fuels. Nikki Haley stated climate change is real but did not feel it is the United States responsibility. The other candidates failed to answer. The good news for young voters is that at last this question has been asked. It remains to be seen if this will affect the election.

- 2. Deleted from the section on District Finances the purchase of the Sampler from Mission Resources as it was discontinued at the time
- 3. Addition of Prayer Guide to the list of items the District is responsible for purchasing for new units
- 4. Changed reference to LUV visits to Nurturing Partner Program

### Mission Today 2021 - Reduced Criteria due to COVID-19

MAKE A DIFFERENCE! Become a Mission Today Unit!!

#### The purpose of promoting a Mission Today Unit is to:

Energize United Methodist Women to be more involved in mission through prayer, study and action. Increase contacts between units and mission personnel and mission projects so the United Methodist Women understand where their money goes. Encourage the use of mission resources through United Methodist Women. Expand concepts of mission, including social justice as mission.

#### What is a Unit?

A unit is any organized group of United Methodist Women within a church or district. Some units are composed of several circles, which periodically get together for a unit meeting.

#### How Do We Become a Mission Today Unit?

In order to be recognized as a Mission Today Unit, (Gold, Silver or Bronze) UMW units must complete a number of the following criteria as indicated above. Activities conducted between January 1-December 31, 2021, will be recognized at annual meetings in 2022. This is an ongoing program, so strive to become a Mission Today Unit!

#### NEW IN 2020 and continuing in 2021:

Mission Today Gold – Complete 10 criteria: 6 with asterisks (\*) and 4 other.\*\*

Mission Today Silver – Complete 8 criteria: 4 with asterisks (\*) and 4 other.\*\*

Mission Today Bronze – Complete 6 criteria: 4 with asterisks (\*) and 2 other.\*\*

\*\*Note: "Other" may also include items with asterisks (\*).

Items in RED were changed due to COVID-19.

#### **CRITERIA:**

#### \*1. The Unit will make a Pledge to Mission.

- \*2. The unit will use the Prayer Calendar at each general meeting or circle meeting of the unit to pray for persons in mission and our mission work with women, children and youth. A new Prayer Calendar is printed each year and may be ordered from the Mission Resource Center.
- \*3. The unit will use at least two programs from the Program Book during the year. A new Program Book is printed every year and may be ordered from the Mission Resource Center.
- \*4. The unit or circle will conduct or participate in at least one mission study each year. Contact your district or conference Mission Coordinator for Education & Interpretation to learn what the studies are for each year. (If members of your unit attend the conference Mission u or your District Mission Study and your unit takes an action growing out of the study, Gift to Mission, ministry related to the study, etc., your unit will meet these criteria.)
- \*5. The unit will have at least two members subscribing to response (1 member subscribing with units less than 15 members; Local unit subscription may count as one.) Order information is available at right. \$24.00 for a one-year print subscription (includes digital subscription); \$20 for a one-year digital only subscription.
- \*6. The unit will implement the Charter for Racial Justice in at least two ways during the year. Possibilities are:
  - Have members read and discuss books and articles about other races and cultures;
  - Sponsor or attend an interethnic event between two or more units;
  - Intentionally recruit women of other ethnic groups to be members and officers of the unit;
  - Use the Resources for Racial Justice Available on our conference website on the "Downloads Available" page under "Mission Resources."
  - Write to elected representatives to support legislation affecting issues such as immigration, affirmative action, low-income programs, civil rights, etc.

If you are a "Justice Today" unit, you have met these criteria. See "Downloads Available" on conference website.

\*7. The unit will have a program and/or complete an action addressing one of the Issue Priorities for 2016-2020.

These are 1. Climate Justice; 2. Maternal and Child Health, 3. Criminalization of Communities of Color and Mass Incarceration; and 4. Economic Inequality. Find information at <a href="https://www.unitedmethodistwomen.org/service-adocacy">www.unitedmethodistwomen.org/service-adocacy</a>.

- \*8. The unit will add at least two new members (one member for units with less than 15 members) to its roll.
- \*9. The unit will have one program from the Social Principles of the United Methodist Church 2017-2020.
- \*10. The unit will contribute to all Five Channels of Mission Giving.
- \*11. The UMW Purpose will be recited at each general and/or circle meeting.
- \*12. The unit will contribute \$186.90 or more to the Legacy Fund.
- 13. At least one member of the unit will attend Mission u and report back to the unit on classes and events they experienced. Virtual participation qualifies as attending.
- 14. At least two members (one member for units with less than 15 members) will attend the district or conference annual meeting and report back to the unit about the event and what they experienced. Virtual participation qualifies as attending.

- 15. The unit will have at least one person joining the United Methodist Women's Action Network to receive and respond to legislative information at least three (3) times a year. (To join, contact the United Methodist Women Washington Office, 100 Maryland Avenue NE, Room 100, Washington, DC 20002. Phone #: 202-488-5660. Email: csad@unitedmethodistwomen.com (Attach to Mission Today report the action that was taken and to which issue.)
- 16. Members will correspond with five persons listed in the Prayer Calendar at least once a year.
- 17. The unit will co-sponsor, with the local church, a Children's Sabbath. (This is a worship service highlighting the needs of children.) The United Methodist Women National Office and the Council of Bishops support this effort. Children's Sabbath materials are on our national website: <a href="https://www.unitedmethodistwomen.org">www.unitedmethodistwomen.org</a> Type "Children's Sabbath" in the search box.
- 18. Each unit or circle meeting will include a "**response** Moment" where an item from **response** magazine will be lifted up as a way to tell the mission story.
- 19. The unit will sponsor one teen member (ages 12 to 17) and/or one young woman member (ages 18 to 39) to at least one conference event during the year.
- 20. At least two members (one member for units with less than 15 members) will attend a district Prayer Breakfast, district Day Apart, conference Spiritual Growth Retreat, or any other special district or conference event other than Ubuntu Day. Virtual participation in any of these events qualify as attending.
- 21. At least two members (one member for units with less than 15 members) will participate in an Ubuntu Day Event. Units may develop their own UBUNTU event in their communities. If checked, explain what you did at bottom of page.
- 22. At least two members (one member for units with less than 15 members) will complete Plan 1 of the Reading Program and give a report to the unit on one of the books read.
- 23. The unit will invite a district or conference officer, other than a member of the unit, to one of the unit meetings during the year and/or for their United Methodist Women's Sunday. This Qualifies as a Local Unit Visit (LUV).
- 24. The unit will add one new teen (ages 12 to 17) and/or one young woman (ages 18 to 39) circle during the year, or one new teen member (ages 12 to 17) or one new young woman member (ages 18 to 39) during the year.
- 25. 100% of the unit's active members will make a gift of at least \$18.69 to the Legacy Fund.
- 26. The 2020 Conference Financial Goal is: To increase unit pledge giving by at least \$5.00 per member. The unit will help accomplish the goal by increasing giving in this channel by at least \$5.00 per member over 2019.
- 27. Each unit will be responsible for supporting at least one local mission project and participate in one Conference Hands-on Mission Project during the year. The local project should be listed on your Mission Today report.



The \$5 per box is asked for each completed box donated to help pay for the shipping costs.

It is asked that \$2 is given for each Hygiene and Menstrual kit to help offset the cost of shipping.

The menstrual kits have increased in value and now valued at \$24 (per UMCOR).

A worship center with cloth or placemats, along with a large bowl of cold water placed on the table. Candles, flowers or a Bible for the table are optional.

#### WORLD THANK OFFERING:

The World Thank Offering is an offering of spontaneous, additional gifts to United Methodist Women given out of gratitude for God's abundance and in celebration of the joys of life. Individuals or families collect such gifts in special boxes or labeled containers. Gifts are brought together in the circle and/or unit once a year, usually with a special service like the one printed here.

#### Prayer for Program Planner(s):

Heavenly God, you are our true provider and redeemer. We thank you for your daily grace. But as we go through our days, we need your help and guidance to tackle the tasks at hand. Call us to attention to witness the daily miracles that you show us, and we often overlook. In your name we pray. Amen.

#### Preparation:

- Make sure all women in the circle or unit have a World Thank Offering box in the months prior to this program for their offering. Women can use a box or other container affixed with a World Thank Offering label (M5034-2008-01/ free for shipping and handling from the Mission Resource Center, see page 81 for ordering information).
- Ask each woman to bring a small rock to the program. Bring a few extra for visitors.
- Ask a few women prior to the program to think about what they are thankful for and to bring something that represents their gratitude. These should be added to the Focus Image.
- Find two volunteers to read the scripture passages in the program. Share the verses with them ahead of the program.
