Important Message Concerning United Methodist Church Disaffiliations

Last summer, the Western Conference of the UMC Annual Conference approved the disaffiliation of a total of 195 churches in our conference. In addition, the Western Conference also closed another 5 churches because of large declines in membership, worship attendance, and/or financial support. That is a loss of 200 churches.

Sadly 40 of those 200 churches are in the Catawba Valley District, and there are more to come. Many are unaware that they can continue as members of the <u>UWF</u>. Since the United Women in Faith is an entirely separate entity from the United Methodist Church, they can keep their unit intact, leaving everything as is except they belong to a new church. (Just let our President know the new name of your church if choosing this option).

If, however, a unit disbands, <u>individuals</u> who wish to remain in association with UWF can join <u>just</u> the UMF at another unit and remain a member of the disaffiliated church, if desired, Page 6 is a document which explains this.

There is a full list of the Catawba Valley District's disaffiliated and recently closed churches on page 5. We are asking the Presidents to reach out to these churches that are near your church and offer their members a UWF home if their unit will be disbanding.

Disaffiliation Document

As we strive to answer the challenges of churches disaffiliating from the United Methodist Church while United Women in Faith members of that church wish to continue to belong to United Women in Faith, we are offering this document with guidance for us all to speak with the same voice and in a tone of affiliation not disaffiliation.

United Women in Faith have built Community and must:

- ◆ remain peaceful
- become resilient
- know all are valued
- remain inclusive
- create change with kindness

Our common purpose is and always has been to support women, children and youth all around the world.

Our PURPOSE has not changed:

We are a Community of women whose PURPOSE is to know God and experience freedom as whole persons through Jesus Christ; to develop a creative, supportive fellowship; and to expand concepts of mission through participation in the global ministries of the church. United Women in Faith is an all-access organization. Membership shall be open to any woman who indicates her desire to belong and to participate in the global mission of the Church through United Women in Faith.

If your church disaffiliates from the United Methodist Church, you may continue your membership in UWF:

- ◆ You may join with an existing UWF unit in a local church remaining in the Conference. A unit in a disaffiliating church may join with a unit in a church remaining in the Conference. They may choose to be a circle of that unit.
- ♦ They may choose to remain a unit in their church. Units may meet in any location they choose. You may hold any office in the local unit but may not serve as a District or Conference President
- A unit may determine its structure to best fulfil the Purpose so that the work of administration, finance, program planning, record keeping and nominations can be carried out.
- Pastors in United Methodist Churches are ex-officio members of the unit in their churches. In the case of a disaffiliated church, the minister would not be an ex-officio member.
