
I am here again to remind you how important the <u>United</u>



HISTORICALLY SPEAKING

LaDonna Butts, 2023 Historian

It has truly been an honor to serve as your Conference Historian these past two years, two years marked with multiple changes. I refer to the time as BC (before COVID/before changes) and AC (after COVID/after changes).

Yes, I realize COVID has not been eradicated, but in 2022 we definitely saw changes as we began to once again hold in-person as well as virtual events. Additionally, we had a name change to the more inclusive United Women in Faith. Our logo changed along with the name; the vibrant new logo reflects the liveliness and vitality we hope to inject into our organization. When the WNCC UMC restructured from twelve to eight districts several years ago, we promoted the headline, "CHANGE IS GOOD!" Well, once again, change is good for a number of reasons.

Although we held both our 2022 Spiritual Growth Retreat and Annual Gathering Celebration at Lake Junaluska, Mission u was once again a virtual event rather than inperson in 2022. However, change was on the horizon for the 2023 Mission u. With notification that our most recent venue, Pfeiffer University, would be unavailable during the summer of 2023, we had the choice of holding another online-only Mission u or seeking another site. Given the change in the curricula from a justice or global issue mission study to a biblical study, the location change to the Catholic Conference Center in Hickory, NC, offered the ideal retreat setting to explore and experience "Living the Kin-dom" with the study of the Lord's Prayer.

I believe none of the 92 attendees will ever look at the Lord's Prayer in the same light as we have memorized and repeated since childhood. But possibly the most notable change in Mission u 2023 was the increase in first-time attendees. Over 17% of our registrants experienced Mission u for the very first time, and all are eager to attend in 2024!

I cannot presume to know what changes we might experience in 2024 and beyond, but FAITH leads me to know we will face them head-on if HOPE is our attitude and focus and LOVE is put into action for women, children, and youth around the world just as it has been since 1869. Just as our foremothers left us, leave a legacy for others to follow.

WE LOVE UBUNTU

What is ubuntu? As we have learned in United Women in Faith, ubuntu means "I am because you are." Through ubuntu service events, we have strengthened our understanding of Matthew 25: 31-40. In a <u>blog article</u> about the Ubuntu Day of Service at Assembly 2022, event co-organizer Michelle Clemons was quoted and explained, "Ubuntu is the *being* of mission. It focuses on relationships, shared experience, and mutuality. Having a positive impact on someone else's life reminds us of the value we bring and gives our lives purpose" (uwfaith.org).

This past October 7th, one of the three WNCC UW Faith Ubuntu Days of Service for 2023, the Uwharrie District Team selected the Mission Response Center in Mooresville, NC, as their Ubuntu event location. Team members brought donations needed to fill Christmas shoe boxes for Project Agape and, once at the MRC, assembled the boxes. The group filled three large bins of Christmas shoe boxes that day. All were proud to accomplish their goals for Project Agape and felt God's love in doing so.

Ubuntu is the meaning of mission. We find creative ways to come together and put love in action. Each time we participate in Ubuntu Days, it is inspirational and lifegiving. We are blessed by serving others, sharing our faith through United Women in Faith, and making hope a reality by making a difference in the lives of women, children, and youth. May all United Women in Faith continue to see God's hand at work and be God's hands at work!
