


## Blue Ridge District Newsletter United Women in Faith

#### A Message from Your President

Our first event is the Zoom mission study with Smoky Mountain in March. Tracey Owens will lead the study, which is an in-depth study of the Lord's Prayer (see cover).

Our local unit members and other members of our churches will be given opportunities to volunteer since the Western North Carolina Conference UMC is the host conference.

2024 is looking like a great year for UWFaith reading. In 2024 the selection of books has been expanded, offering more choices. The best way to find out what is available in the form of resources is, of course, the United Women in Faith website. You can find the site by going to uwfaith.org/resources. When you get there, spend a few minutes exploring the many areas that can help you: Podcasts, *response*, Reading Program, Program Resources, Mission u Curricula, and The Prayer Guide.

**Response** and Faith Talks podcasts are part of the Reading Program. In the Reading Program section of the resource website, you can download the 2024 list of recommended books. There you will find the different Reading Program Plans. You can also download a list of books going back to 2019 that can be included in your reading plans.

New this year is a virtual page at **bookshop.org/shop/uwfaith** where you can browse and purchase most of the 2024 reading program books while earning 10% back for United Women in Faith.

Dates for our District Book Club meetings this year are Feb.24, May 25, July 20, and Sept. 28. The Spiritual Growth category can be covered by reading the Mission u book and attending the district mission study virtually in March or by attending Mission u in

July.

Collins:
With a Hallelujah Heart

Our first book club meeting in 2024 is February 24. As part of Black History month, we will discuss *Susan Angeline Collins: With a Hallelujah Heart* from the 2023 Education for Mission list. This book is about the life of African American missionary Susan Collins who overcame economic, education, gender, race, religious, and other obstacles surrounding Africa's colonization to serve as a stalwart missionary, leader, teacher, nurse, construction manager, and surrogate mother to "her girls" in the northern Angolan high plateau. Leader for that meeting will be our own Barbara Campbell.

I am currently reading *The Seed Keeper*, a novel about a Native American woman. The more I read, the more I look forward to what will happen next. If you have a book that you are enjoying, please let me know so that I can pass the information on to others. Suggestions for Book Club readings and leaders will also be appreciated.

#### Historian

"Welcoming the Stranger"

National Mission Institutions along both coasts and the southern border are dealing with masses of men, women and children seeking entry into the United States. There are many problems: immediate physical needs, language barriers, multiple and complex legal requirements, and, at times, hostile attitudes.

This is not new to United Women in Faith! Our foremothers faced a similar circumstance! The Woman's Home Missionary Society (WHMS), founded in 1880 initiated ministries among immigrants soon after its founding:

- In 1886, Mrs. Helen A. Matthews was the first Protestant missionary at Castle Garden, NY, assigned by the WHMS to "work the docks" and befriend immigrants in whatever ways possible. She reported: 1) They did not speak English. 2) Some were without sponsors and didn't know what to do. 3) There were unscrupulous sponsors. 4) Many were scared and perplexed by the "red tape" and needed a friend. In 1888 the WHMS opened "The Girls Lodging House" (later "Immigrant Girls Home") a single-floor rented space near Castle Garden. During the first eight months, it served 482 lodgers.
- In 1910 the U. S. Government gave approval for the WHMS to appoint a deaconess (Carrie Pierson) to work among the detained immigrants at Angel Island, San Francisco Bay, especially Japanese "picture brides." During her eighteen months, she assisted forty-seven "brides" arriving in groups which could number 150-200. Deaconess Katherine Maurer continued from 1911 to 1951, commuting daily to/from Angel Island, working with incoming persons, both transients and detainees of many nationalities.

The bronze plaque that identified the "Immigrant Girls Home" has been displayed at Ellis Island since 1980. A statue of Katherine Maurer (to the right), the "Angel of Angel Island," stands in a downtown San Francisco park.

Deaconess were also assigned at the Ports of Boston and Philadelphia; and the community centers opened in cities where immigrant groups located.

- 1. Pledge to Mission
- 2. Special Mission Recognition (pins/financial gift in honor of someone)
- 3. Gift to Mission (variety of cards Thank You, Thinking of You, New Baby, Happy Birthday, Congratulations, Peace, A Special Day, Merry Christmas and in the Service of Christ). Cards are an undesignated gift of at least \$5.
- 4. Gift in Memory (at least \$5) honors the memory of a family member or friend.
- 5. World Thank Offering (given once a year through your unit)
