




IDA B. THE QUEEN: The Extraordinary Life and Legacy of Ida B. Wells

Join us on Saturday, February 3, for an exciting discussion about a remarkable woman. How's this for an amazing life: Ida Belle Wells Barnett was born in 1862, an enslaved person in Mississippi. She became a teacher, a journalist, a wife, a mother, and a community activist. She died in Chicago in 1931. In 2020, she was awarded a Pulitzer Prize for being an outstanding and courageous investigative reporter! (Yes, she'd been dead for nearly 90 years.)

It's safe to say most modern women have never heard of her, a woman who put her life on the line to protest segregation in transportation and the horrors of lynching in the late 1800s and early 1900s. It's also safe to say that there is a lot we can learn from Ida B. about leadership and loving our neighbors as ourselves.

Everything Is Possible With God!

Happy New Year and God's blessings on all of you! As my third year as your District Treasurer gets under way, I am excited and very hopeful that we will meet and exceed our 2024 goal of \$50,000.

Thanks to all of you for making Mission possible through your generous giving in 2023! The following is a list of units who contributed to all five channels of Mission Giving:

Our total giving last year was \$65,204. Unfortunately, this amount was \$12,652 less than was given in 2022. Our undesignated giving totaled \$57,321 which means we were \$12,679 short of meeting our pledge of \$70,000. While this is disturbing news, with a lot of prayer and hard work, we <u>can</u> meet our 2024 pledge of \$50,000. The good news for 2023 giving is that we exceeded our Special Mission Recognition Giving by 10.3%. It is a wonderful way to honor those who serve and to show our love and appreciation for all they have done.

Unit Treasurers - When sending a check to the District Treasurer, always complete a "Remittance Form" even if you are sending an SMR pin order or a Gift to Mission card order. Checks should always be written to the Northern Piedmont District UMW or UWF. If, at any time, you need a remittance form, SMR pin order form, Gift to Mission card order form, or Legacy Form, please let me know. You may also download these forms at wnccumw.org (under the Mission Resources tab press Downloads Available). Keep in mind that to meet the first criteria for becoming a 'Mission Today Unit,' a pledge must be made and met.

If your unit has not yet sent in your Pledge Form for 2024 indicating your unit's pledge, along with address/e-mail/phone information for your unit President and Treasurer, please have your treasurer enclose it with your unit's first quarter remittance. Unit Treasurers are responsible for sending this completed form to me – even if the information is the same as last year. I want to make sure that all unit Treasurers receive my quarterly letters so it is very important that I update my records each year.
