
Thoughts from your President

Our 2024 Adult Mission Study

Welcome Home is an adult curriculum that explores how we can know God as an intimate friend who welcomes us. Abiding in God's safety and dwelling in God's provision, allows us to open our hearts to a fuller embrace of the power and presence of God so that we may find our home in God. Participants are invited to dig deeper into what it means to live in the kin-dom of God and how this helps us to develop practices for building and existing in healthier communities.

Resources for Children and Youth

Cultivating Symbiosis: The Nature of God's Kin-dom is a youth curriculum that uses the idea of symbiosis to explore relationships with others and with God. Youth will examine different kinds of relationships and understand them as an ongoing journey toward the kin-dom. There is a symbiosis between our relationships to each other as humans and our relationship to God. By drawing closer to one another, we can callectively move step by step, toward creating



one another, we can collectively move, step by step, toward creating God's kin-dom on earth as it is in heaven.



Me in the Kin-dom! is a children's curriculum that helps children explore the kin-dom of God through the lens of the Lord's Prayer. Children will experience how they are unique members of God's kin-dom and learn they are also part of a larger community that welcomes all of God's children. Children will explore many Scriptures that will help them to learn to see, hear, and love as Christ teaches. This enables us to accept each other as God created us to be. Each session includes Scripture study,

discussion, music, artistic expression, and even some opportunities for children to participate in outreach to others.

Our Q1 remittance will be sent to the conference this week. Year-to-date, we have paid \$5,462.80 against our Pledge to Mission so far, which is 15.6%. This is behind where we were hoping to be by this point, but we will count our blessings. Year-to-date Mission giving paid to Western North Carolina Conference, including designated gifts is \$8,363.18. We have also paid \$37.38 to National for Legacy Fund. In addition, we have given \$2,149 cash for our hygiene kits through our Mission Study held on February 24th. Thank you, Uwharrie District, on behalf of all the women, youth and children you are helping!

UWFaith zoom event (UWFaith Digital portal **Read Together**) had A Special Reading Program **Author Talk** with Rev. Dr. Erin Beasley and Rev. Dr. Tori C. Butler. Their book, *I'm Black. I'm Christian. I'm Methodist.* is a **2024 Reading Program** featured Bonus Book selection. In I'm Black. I'm Christian. I'm Methodist, ten Black women and men explore life through the lens of compelling, personal accounts. They are leaders whose lives are tangible demonstrations of the power of a divine purpose and evidence of what grace really means in face of hardship, disappointment, and determination. "The confluence of the everyday indignities of being Black in America; the outrageous, egregious, legalized lynching of George Floyd; and the unforgivable disparities exposed once again by COVID—19 have conspired together to create a seminal moment in America and in The United Methodist Church in which we must find the courage to say unambiguously 'Black Lives Matter.' To stumble or choke on those words is beneath the gospel," says Bishop Gregory Palmer, who wrote the foreword to the collection.

Edited by Rudy Rasmus – Senior Pastor with his wife, Juanita, at St. John's Downtown Church in Houston, Texas – the essays in this collection each begin with the central identities of Black, Christian, and Methodist, but they also represent different journeys of confronting centuries of White supremacy in our religious and secular institutions. Weaving together autobiography and spiritual formation, together they represent a significant contribution to our theological understanding of racism.

The next Read Together: _This Here Flesh_ Discussion is May 6, 2024 07:00 PM Join United Women in Faith members and friends for a Read Together small group discussion of This Here Flesh: Spirituality, Liberation, and the Stories That Makes Us_ by Cole Arthur Riley. Mission Today

Being a Mission Today unit is important for having educational and missional activities. We have not included the current Mission Today Criteria in this Newsletter issue since it is pending changes by the Conference Mission Education & Interpretation committee. We will be providing the updated version soon and will distribute accordingly.

The purpose of promoting a Mission Today Unit is to:

Energize United Women in Faith to be more involved in mission through prayer, study and action. Increase contacts between units and mission personnel and mission projects so the United Women in Faith understand where their money goes. Encourage the use of mission resources through United Women in Faith. Expand concepts of mission, including social justice as mission.

What is a Unit?

A unit is any organized group of United Women in Faith within a church or district. Some units are composed of several circles, which periodically get together for a unit meeting.

How Do We Become a Mission Today Unit?

In order to be recognized as a Mission Today Unit, (Gold, Silver or Bronze) UWFAITH units must complete a number of the criteria listed.

For example by doing 6 (outlined by Bronze requirement) out of the 27 listed your unit can receive recognition as a Bronze unit. The 6 may be:

You or with the help from your nurturing partner have **Pledge Service** for Mission. At your meetings, reciting **UWFAITH Purpose**, reading the **Prayer Calendar** and giving a **Response moment** at your meetings. The new **Program Book** has more than two programs requirement. Your unit contributing to each of the **Five Channels of Mission Giving**.

If you have two (or more) attending the upcoming Uwharrie District Prayer Breakfast it will count as one criteria activity completed for a mission today unit.

Membership Nurture and Outreach

In the 1st Quarter 2024 Newsletter the challenge for the all inclusive "Move for Mission" was introduced for groups to move by walking, running, dancing, chair exercising, doing Zumba, hiking, knitting, reading, or any other activity that they decide to do together raising undesignated funds.

The previous fundraising contest of presenting a Special Mission Recognition (SMR) pin

to a unit was based on the unit with the largest number of walkers on each of the scheduled walks. Those unit names were put into a bowl and one drawn for a SMR pin. Now those units with members that are not able to Walk for Mission that raise \$200 or



more in a "Move for Mission" activity raising undesignated funds will have their names added to the drawing bowl (this year there is a new SMR design – Our new Logo).

No matter the activity you choose, please send your information to me of how you are Moving for Mission so I can share your accomplishments. All "Move for Mission" funds raised that are not collected at the Mission Walks should be sent to Jeanette Mixon, our UWFaith Uwharrie District Treasurer, before the end of the year.

If you prefer to walk individually or with a group from your unit on a different day that would be great. Just have your treasurer turn the money in to Jeanette Mixon so she can record on the quarterly remittance the amount and the number of walkers who participated.
