



Comforting Children in North Carolina

Seventeen years ago, Diane Sims had an idea sent by the Holy Spirit. To this day, the First United Methodist Women in Faith of Murphy, North Carolina, continue to make her inspiration a reality.

The mission was to reach out to children in the community whose families were in crisis. Diane Sims, with the help of Sheila Snow, designs comfort bags. Snow sews cloth bags, and Sims draws and paints a different animal on each one. Then Snow chooses ribbon to match each animal and adds handles. The Willing Hands Circle of United Women in Faith at First United Methodist Church of Murphy, North Carolina, create and deliver comfort bags to local children in need.


United Women in Faith purchase and fill each bag with personal hygiene items and toys.

Half of the bags are delivered to the Children Advocacy Center director at the local sheriff's office. The remaining bags are given to REACH, a nonprofit shelter for domestic violence survivors. In 2023, 26 bags were created and filled.

These bags provide comfort to children who need extra love

during a difficult time. This way, Sims, Snow, and the women's group fulfill the vision God shared: "And blessed is she who believed that there would be a fulfillment of what was spoken to her by the Lord." (Luke 1:45)

To: All United Women in Faith Sisters across the WNCC Conference,

I want to take this opportunity to thank you for all that you do in your church, your community, and especially through your participation in United Women in Faith. We have a challenge ahead of us. We all are aware of the effects of disaffiliation throughout our conference. Last year our Mission Giving was the lowest that I can remember. Our Mission Giving in 2023 was \$336, 727 to the National Office compared to \$410,968 the previous year. This is a 18% decrease. Our financial goal for 2024 is for each unit to increase their giving to the 2019 (pre-pandemic) level. If your unit is already doing that, I challenge you to do even more.

According to the Membership, Nurture, and Outreach report from the 2023 Annual Celebration, we have a membership of 14,915 members in 425 units (recent numbers at the end of 2023 are not vet available.)

What if:

18

Every member gave up One Starbucks coffee once a month . . .

(this is as cheap as you can get at Starbucks) 14,915 x 12 x \$2.50 = \$447,450 What if:

Every member sent just ONE Gift to Mission Card . . . 14,915 x \$5.00 = \$74,575 Every unit gave ONE additional Gift to Mission Card ... 425 x \$5.00 = \$2,125

What if:

Every unit purchased just ONE plain gold Special Mission Recognition Pin... $425 \times 40.00 = 17,000$

(Check with your district treasurer about other pins that are available)

What if:

Every member sent three (3) Gift in Memory cards in lieu of a sympathy card . . . $14,915 \times $15.00 = $223,725$

What if:

Every unit asked their local congregation to help with the World Thank Offering... 425 x \$250.00 = \$106,250

GRAND Total OVER \$800,000 IMAGINE!

SPECIAL NEWS FROM PROJECT AGAPE:

Nara Melkonyan, the Director of Project AGAPE, sends out regular newsletters regarding the situation in Armenia. Our own Beverly Bard (former MEI Coordinator) always receives one and forwards the information on to other interested individuals. Following is a special email from Beverly regarding Nara's latest newsletter and changes to Project AGAPE's Donation Policies. Nara states authorities have mandated an important update on new regulations on their donation policies by the Armenian Custom Office. The authorities have mandated that only NEW ITEMS CAN BE IMPORTED TAX-FREE. Due to this recent change in government regulations, they are no longer able to accept used items, as they are now subject to taxes upon importation to the country. Nara states that they want to express gratitude for your ongoing support and understanding as we adapt to these changing circumstances. Your unwavering commitment to Project AGAPE remains the cornerstone of our success, and we are confident that together we will overcome this challenge with the same compassion and resilience that define our Christian spirit. Nara also stated that there was a surge of support towards Armenia when there was an exodus of Armenians from Artsakh, but disappointment of aid consisting of used items that proved to be of little or no use. Taxes were levied on all used items. The authorities have mandated that only NEW ITEMS can be imported tax-free. Please pass this information on. Thank you!
