In the March/April issue of *response* magazine the maps in this issue show the missions supported by United Women in Faith. During 2022 and 2023 \$7 million was allocated to the U.S. (101 institutions) and international missions. If you have a chance check out the maps in *response* to see where your mission giving has been allocated. We support hospitals, schools, agricultural projects, microenterprise projects, and other grants to women societies, ecumenical organizations and grassroots group, scholarships to nearly 500 students around the worlds including scholarships to student here in the WNCC, and the support of eight regional missionaries. Spring has sprung, and Easter has come. He is risen; He is risen indeed!!

We have completed Q1 collections and submitted our Q1 remittance to the Conference in March. We sent \$13,585.00 or 13.5% of our Pledge to Mission. Total Mission Giving paid to WNCC was \$16,944.60.

Local Treasurers, your Q2 Remittances are due in by May 24th. You will be receiving a letter from me in early May with additional information.

I would like to share what God has done for me recently. On February 9th, He put the thought in my head that I should move back to Thomasville where I grew up. I moved to Welcome 31 years ago to be closer to work, handbells, and softball, all of which took place in Winston-Salem, but none of which I do any more. My church, my mother, and my friends are primarily in the Fair Grove/Thomasville area. By the 19th, I was under contract in a townhouse in Thomasville.

During those 10 days, I often questioned how quickly things were happening, but there were <u>so many</u> God-Winks throughout that time and since that have resolved any questions I had. For example, the house was more than I wanted to spend, but my brother assured me that location was worth the extra money. God knew that there was another interested buyer, something I did not know, so I had to move fast to get the place He had chosen for me. The house has a huge attic that was not mentioned or shown online. There are several people in the neighborhood that I already know including someone I taught high school with 40 years ago. I dreaded telling my neighbor that I was moving, but he brought his trailer over to take things to the landfill for me and knew of a young man who is now under contract to buy my old house.

Our Wonderful Creator heard my unspoken prayer, knew my need, and provided the perfect answer. Friends, family, and my preacher have all helped pack, move, haul more to the dump, clean, and unpack. It has been a lot of work but it has been joyful fellowship as well. The new home is beautiful, and my furniture fits perfectly. Thank you, Papa God, for your wisdom and provision!






Protecting God's creation and those who are disproportionately affected by the climate crisis is more than our belief; it is one of our core principles and a matter of justice.

Unfortunately, our abuses to creation and one another, our exploitative systems and relationships, and our reliance on fossil fuels have gotten us to the point of planetary climate collapse.

Make your voice heard in demanding climate justice!

We ask the local, state, and federal government and corporations to:

- Increase clean, 100% renewable, and just energy infrastructure with equitable
 considerations aligned with the Jemez Principles and the Principles for Environmental
 Justice, that are good for people and creation. Prioritize investments, opportunities,
 hiring, and leadership of Indigenous people, youth, women, elderly, Asian, Pacific Islander,
 Black, Latino, and other communities directly impacted by the climate crisis and
 extractive industries, and communities historically marginalized.
- 2. Align existing and new policies to fossil fuel non-proliferation and phase down and out of existing fossil fuel extraction and consumption in a swift, equitable, and just manner aiming for 70% emission reductions by 2030 and 100% by 2050.¹
- 3. Align targets and practices to contribute the U.S. fair share of climate finance, loss and damage contributions as a historical emitter, and emission reductions in order remain under the 1.5 C warming limit established during the Paris Agreement.²
