Our local units are active in a wide variety of local mission projects, including food banks, clothing closets, schools, etc. We are most often involved in missions beyond our communities through our Pledge to Mission and other channels of giving. Missions "over there" are sometimes "out of sight, out of mind." We see the needs in our communities and sometimes question why UWFaith continues to emphasize the importance of National Mission Institutions and our international mission projects.

This is especially true when we see the destruction wrought by Hurricane Helene all around us. Yet I encourage us to remember there are women, children, and youth in desperate need all over the world. We live in a nation with abundant resources compared with many nations. More importantly, we serve an abundant God who reminds us to have a "manna mindset."

Exodus 16:15-20 tells of God providing manna, commanding the people to gather as much as they needed. Some gathered much and some gathered little, but everyone had as much as they needed. Those who tried to hoard the manna failed.

During our travelogue, we will do a project for a local mission and share creative ways to put a familiar face on those projects farther away.

WNCC Hurricane Helene Response By the Numbers: [Reprinted from WNCC website here.]
The Western North Carolina Conference resources United Methodist Churches and their communities in North Carolina's 44 westernmost counties. Of those 44 counties, 22 were directly impacted by Hurricane Helene.

The WNCC and its churches organized swiftly after Helene devastated our area. During our initial response, 30 United Methodist churches in our unaffected counties served as collection hubs for donated supplies from local churches and communities. Those collected supplies were then delivered to the nine churches serving as distribution sites in the affected counties. The supplies are then distributed to the local communities, neighboring churches, local fire departments, and other partnering organizations.

Thus far, United Methodists in Western NC have:

- Collected and delivered an estimated 1.5 million+ bottles of water to the impacted areas
- **Fed thousands** of their neighbors
- Delivered diapers and formula to the doors of families in need
- Opened their facilities to **provide free childcare** for families of first responders & emergency personnel
- Set up charging stations and WIFI hotspots
- Provided access to shower trailers and laundry facilities
- Distributed thousands of cleaning kits to local communities and emergency services
- Offered hospitality and shelter for emergency personnel

As we move from this initial stage of the relief phase toward the longer phase of cleanup and recovery, the WNCC will begin sending in Early Response Teams to help. **Our first ERT deployed Tuesday, October 8,** leaving from Davidson UMC and traveling to Spruce Pine UMC. Within the first 10 days following the storm, **more than 500 United Methodists signed up to complete the required ERT training** to serve during the stabilization phase between relief and recovery.

Brooks-Howell Home Needs Our Help

We have all seen images of the devastation in the western part of North Carolina caused by Hurricane Helene. Asheville is one of the many hard-hit areas.

Asheville is home to Brooks-Howell
Home (BHH), a small continuing care
retirement home located on a 10-acre
site near downtown Asheville. It is a
not-for-profit ministry owned by
United Women in Faith. This community consists of United Women in Faith
and Global Ministries' retired missionaries and deaconesses who have served
The United Methodist Church as well
as retirees from the Asheville and North
Carolina area at large.

Through the grace of God, all BHH residents and employees are safe. Fallen trees have caused some property damage. Electricity, water, and communication capability were severely compromised. It is expected to be many weeks before the City of Asheville has water

service, and that creates a variety of problems for Brooks-Howell and of course, all of Asheville. Helene's devastation is stressing staff, residents and resources.

There are three ways you can help Brooks-Howell and the residents and staff there in Asheville right now as they continue to deal with Helene's devastation:

PRAY - Continue to keep the residents and staff of Brooks-Howell in your prayers, and all of the people in western North Carolina that have experienced the devastation of Hurricane Helene.

GIVE MONEY - Among the many urgent needs is MONEY for costs associated with the hurricane and not budgeted.
