Retreat Leader: Rev. Aryn Williams-Ruebel

Rev. Aryn Williams-Ruebel comes from a long line of faithful women. She is the daughter of David and Sara Williams. Aryn grew up in East Bend, NC, and attended Prospect UMC. She started attending United Methodist Women with her mom and grandmamma as a young girl.

Aryn attended East Carolina University where she achieved a Bachelor's degree in Psychology and a Master's degree in Health Education.

Aryn was very active in the formation of a Young Women's UMW Circle at Trinity UMC in New Bern and a new UMW group at St. Luke's UMC in Hickory. She served briefly as the communications coordinator for Catawba Valley District UMW.

After working in various careers Aryn received the call to go into ministry in 2011 while a member at St. Luke's UMC. After



attending a formative Walk to Emmaus experience, Aryn began serving as a local pastor in 2012 in Sylva, NC, while attending seminary at Candler School of Theology. She was ordained in 2018 and has served in the local church in Haywood and Jackson Counties.

Aryn has been married to Jay Ruebel since 2015, and together they are proud to have three wonderful daughters, Gracie, Norah, and Journi.

Aryn currently serves as Pastor at Cashiers UMC in the Smoky Mountain District.

Mission Speaker: Maggie Armstrong



Maggie Armstrong started October 21 as the Director of Recovery for the Western North Carolina Conference, not quite one month after Hurricane Helene stunned the state with its ferocity and devastation.

Maggie is the daughter of two Western North Carolina Conference United Methodist pastors, Jamie Armstrong and the late Elizabeth Graves. As such, she was perhaps destined to return to this conference. She grew up within the conference (including Swain and Haywood Counties) and spent a lot of time at Lake Junaluska.

Maggie has also lived in the Chapel Hill and Durham areas, in Florida, and in Germany. Earlier this year she came home to North Carolina to become a Fellow for the Piedmont Triad Regional Council, writing grants and policies.

Before coming to her current position, Maggie spent three years with the Florida Conference as Hurricane Volunteer Coordinator. She then earned a Master of Science degree at United Nations University & University of Bonn in Geography of Environmental Risks and Human Security, a program that takes an interdisciplinary approach towards environmental risks, natural hazards, and their implications for human-nature relations.

Pianist: Catherine Ritch

Catherine, a native of Matthews, NC, is a published composer and author of inspirational fiction, nonfiction, and children's books with 27 books currently in print, and seven others currently in process. A frequent speaker and musician in a variety of venues, she has entertained or spoken to audiences around the globe.

Catherine was selected as the International Profile of The United Methodist Church for September 2009 because of her continual work and efforts with missions for schools in areas of natural disasters.

A radio personality once said of Ritch, "Catherine's lightning quick wit and musical talent are astonishing enough, but



combined with her neverending source of positive energy, the woman is a ball of fire that's sure to inspire."

Put Catherine on a piano, organ, or keyboard, and from Bach to Broadway to Boogie to the Best of Gospel, she'll have the audience enthralled with the rhythms of life.

One of Catherine's most fun ventures is a comedy series featuring Miz Eudora Rumph of Smackass Gap, NC, which happens to be a real place (where Methodists have The Hinton Retreat Center). Dressed as Miz Eudora, she has entertained doctors and medical personnel, ministers and bishops, teachers, and other groups with "Laughter Is the Best Medicine" through the simple mountain wit and wisdom of her Appalachian grandmother. In Catherine's words, "People in today's society take themselves way too seriously or get caught up in unnecessary stresses. A good dose of Miz Eudora is a cure for all that ails you, and also for that which don't!"

Catherine has been introduced as an author, composer, comedienne, entertainer, teacher, musician, inspirational/motivational speaker, and volunteer-in-mission, but her favorite way to be acknowledged is "friend."

Charlie hails from Sarasota, FL, and began playing the piano around four years old. 
Take a Walk on the Wild Side

Jazzercising 4 Jesus with LaDonna Butts


